Agency Reporting Compliance

The Statistical Analysis Center (SAC) will soon begin publishing agency reporting compliance statistics. We currently publish these compliance statistics for Death in Custody and Use of Force but this will soon extend to Traffic Stop Reporting, E-Citation, NIBRS submissions, Employment Data, and more to come.

This reporting is intended to add transparency for the public as well as helping agencies track their own compliance.

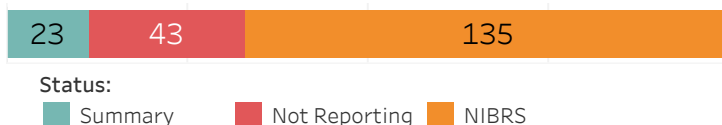
NIBRS Transition

January 2021 has arrived along with the National NIBRS transition deadline. All law enforcement agencies in the State of Nebraska, along with the rest of the nation, will only submit crime data using NIBRS format.

As of December of 2020, there are 135 out of 201 agencies across Nebraska who report data using NIBRS. Summary data will **not** be accepted by the FBI for any incidents beginning January of 2021.

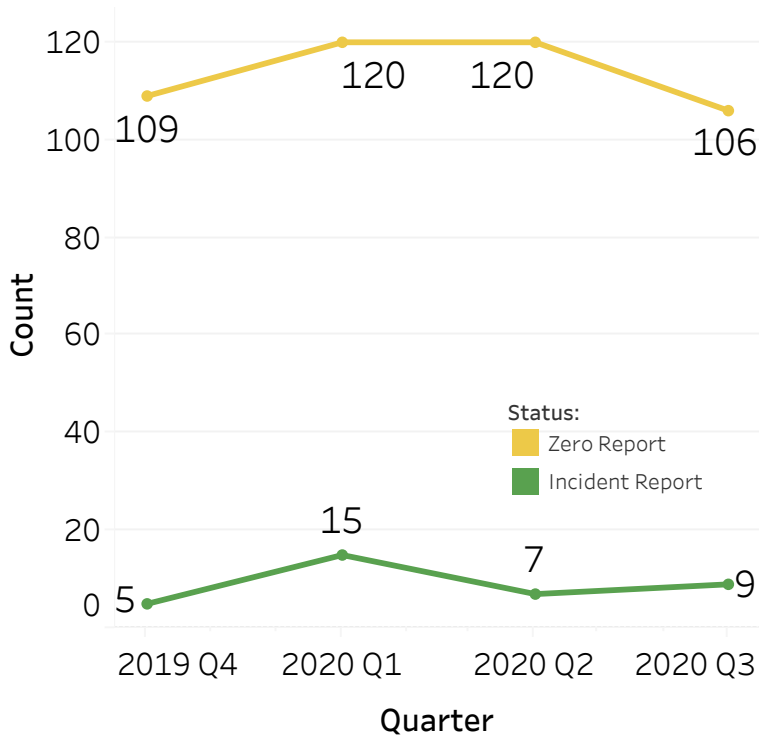
The Nebraska Crime Commission has a **free**, single-incident entry solution available to all law enforcement agencies who still need to make the switch. This does not replace a dedicated RMS but it is a viable NIBRS compliant reporting option for agencies with only a few incidents or arrests to report each month.

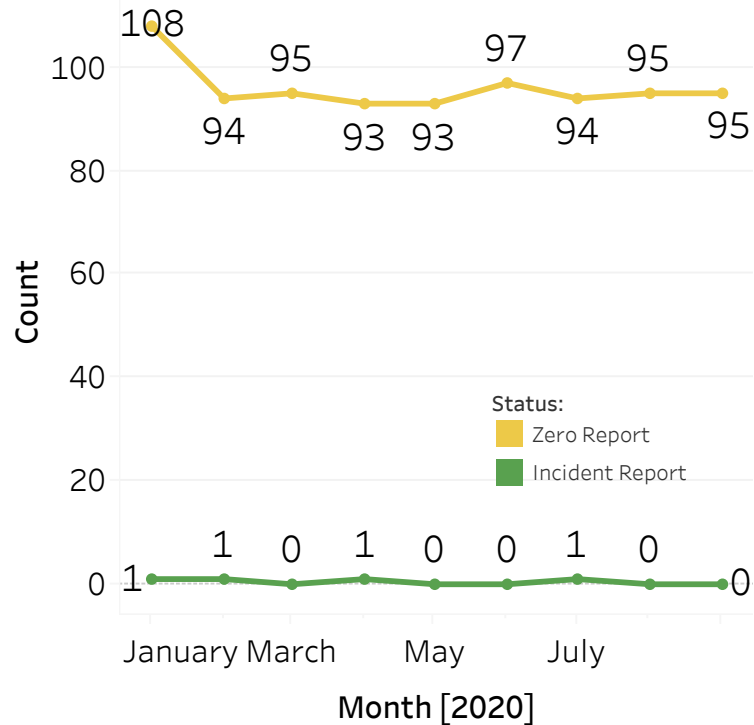




### Death In Custody Reporting Counts

### NCVRS Announcement

The Nebraska Crime Victim Reporting System launched on July 1st, 2020. NCVRS serves as a comprehensive database, analysis, and reporting tool for agencies to better serve their clients in need, and access is granted to agencies at no cost.

NCVRS is hosted via NCJIS, a secure and confidential online system for criminal justice usage. Interested agencies may contact the NCVRS Helpdesk by emailing [NCC.NCVRSHelpdesk@Nebraska.gov](mailto:NCC.NCVRSHelpdesk@Nebraska.gov) for more information, and to get set up with account access. Current NCJIS users can use their existing accounts to access NCVRS as well.

NCVRS allows for data input, monitoring, and reporting of various victim assistance types, such as domestic violence, sexual assault, child advocacy, and other presenting issues. Agencies can also take advantage of automated reporting functionality, which allows users to generate various report types and formats in just a few clicks. This includes generating quarterly reports for the Office for Victims of Crime’s Performance Measurement Tool (PMT), saving agencies hours of manual input.

The Nebraska Crime Commission is currently seeking additional victim assistance agencies in Nebraska to participate in this system, at no cost.
