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Introduction

JCMS users will now be able to download all the data entered in the JCMS for their agency by program type through the data export function. Users will have access to the data export function as needed, and it can be downloaded when it is convenient for them. It should be noted that the data extracted through this process will not be the same as the reports the JCMS currently generate as described below.

The export function provides data without date ranges, so users will receive all cases, open and closed, from the date data entry in the JCMS began. This is different for each program based on funding, so the data set could include several years' worth of data.

The data will be downloaded in multiple spreadsheets as the JCMS is built into different tables, and each table will be in a separate sheet. These tables include, but are not limited to, profile, education, address, (all from the intake section of the JCMS), as well as tables for each of the tabs on the bottom of the JCMS screen. **We do not recommend using the "all program types" export.** For more information please see Appendix E.

Since the data will come in multiple spreadsheets, users may want to connect the tables together to link the names and demographic information to program information or outcomes. The names of the youth will not appear on every spreadsheet, but unique ID numbers (profile ID, program ID, etc.) can help connect the information across spreadsheets.

The data will also come across in code value for drop-down menu options. What this means is what users see in the JCMS has a code assigned to each option behind the scenes. An example would be the field "Youth Employed" where in the JCMS the options show as No and Yes, but behind the scenes they are 0 and 1 respectively. Any field that is a narrative field where users type information in, like City in the address, will come up as it has been entered.

The column headers in the spreadsheets will not exactly match the labels of the fields in the JCMS. Within the code tables that follow, the field name as written in the spreadsheet will be listed first, followed by the way the fields are labeled in the JCMS (i.e. Gender_Id – Gender).

The tables/spreadsheets associated with the tabs in the JCMS can have more than one entry per youth as users can add multiple contacts, referrals, etc. As such, there could be more entries on these spreadsheets than the total number of cases entered. This is called a one-to-many, meaning one youth can have many entries. Keep this in mind while reviewing the tables.

This document will provide appropriate code tables to clarify the labels represented by each code value, along with step-by-step procedures for how to: access the agency data (see Appendix A) and combine/merge the tables together (see Appendix B). When reviewing these procedures, it may be helpful to go over some of the terminology and general structure of the JCMS tables in Appendix C.







10) By default, the new table (and sheet) name will be named *Merge1*, which can be changed by the user. When finished with the "Power Query Editor", click "Close & Load".

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11) The newly created table will be displayed in its own tab.

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12) Repeat Steps 1-11 to match the other tables provided in your JCMS data extract/download as needed. You may only need to do this once depending on what you are using the data for, or you can merge in as many tables as needed.

Important items to note:

- a. Profile_Id will be used when combining any Demographic table to a Program table.
 These merges will mostly be one-to-one matches, however in some rare cases, a single
 Profile_Id may link to multiple Program_Ids.
- b. Program_Id will be used when combining any Program table to one of its programspecific tabs. These merges are more likely to contain one-to-many matches but may also include one-to-one matches as well as some unmatched cases.
- c. In order to link a demographic file to a program table you may need to use both Profile_Id and Program_Id. The examples on the next page show combining tables first using Profile_Id to get one merged table, followed by connecting the merged table to a program specific tab using Program_Id.



Appendix E – Impact of JCMS Changes

In January 2020, the JCMS was updated to remove the "add case to client" feature which had allowed multiple cases to be attached to the same client ID within the same agency. This was most common in ATDs where a youth could be on an electronic monitor while working with a tracker, however this function was also used if a youth returned to a program after a previous completion or enrolled in a separate program within the same agency (such as diversion and truancy). If there is a client with multiple cases in the JCMS, the data export spreadsheets will have multiple entries in the demographic tables with the same profile ID. If you merge any additional sheets to a demographic table, the data from the additional sheets will be attached to each profile Id, duplicating data. Just be aware of this so you can account for duplicate data.

This is the reason we do not recommend the "all program types" data export. If a client has more than one program type associated with their client ID, there is no field that indicates which program type in the demographic tables. As such, any merging with additional tables to an "all program types" demographic profile will possibly match incorrect program information to client ID numbers.

In July 2020, the diversion screens were updated to include a new case plan tab and corresponding case plan activity tab. Please keep in mind that when using the data export function, you may have some clients on the historical tabs and some on the updated tabs so you would need to review all tables for the most complete information. If you are only looking at cases referred after July 2020, you can use the current tabs. You may also see blank spaces in the new case plan tabs and activity spreadsheets for the earlier cases where this option was not available.

Any changes made to the JCMS over the course of the project may result in the appearance of missing data. Fields that were removed from the JCMS were retained behind the scenes, so you may have fields in the spreadsheets that you do not see in the JCMS. One example is on the ATD screens there used to be a narrative box for Presenting Offense, but that was removed in favor of a Charges Tab. If you cannot find the field from the spreadsheet on the screens, it is likely it was removed from the JCMS.

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
