OVERVIEW

The Tactical Medicine (TacMed) Course for Law Enforcement Instructors is an intensive 2-day, 20-hour program that integrates live-fire and tactical medicine exercises. Our curriculum aligns with the Principle Guidelines of Instruction set by the Committee for Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC). It covers essential aspects of tactical medicine, including the use of basic trauma kits, treating hemorrhages, chest trauma, and other critical injuries.

On the first day, students complete the Basic TacMed Course (Medical Module Only) to familiarize themselves with the curriculum. The second day involves teaching assignments where students present specific topics, including firearms skills and drills, demonstrating and directing these exercises on the range.

All teach-backs are evaluated, and shooting drills are scored with a minimum standard required for passing. Attendance alone does not guarantee certification. Successful students will receive a copy of the course outline, PowerPoint presentations, videos, and TECC guidelines.

In the classroom, each student will get plenty of hands-on practice applying various bandages, tourniquets, and packing wounds. Practice medical equipment will be provided.



Topics Covered - Live-Fire Portion

- Advanced one-handed shooting/weapon manipulations
- Primary and support hand-only weapon presentation
- Primary and support hand-only reloading
- Primary and support hand-only weapon malfunction drills
- Fighting from the ground
- Shooting from prone, supine, and lateral recumbent positions
- Self-assessment, treatment of life-threatening bleeding, and one-hand tourniquet application
- Single and multiple officer rescue tactics under
- Rapid patient assessment and treatment while under duress
