

Effective Victim Response Training Series



By addressing crime victims' needs, agencies can eliminate barriers and support victims' participation in the criminal justice system, thereby improving investigations, prosecution of crimes, and public safety.

The [Enhancing Law Enforcement Response to Victims \(ELERV\) Strategy](#) provides a roadmap for police agencies to implement a victim-centered approach. Serving victims effectively requires preparation and strategies embedded at all layers of the justice process. Framed around the seven critical needs of victims – **safety, support, information, access, continuity, voice, and justice** – this training series will provide law enforcement personnel:

- an overview of victims' rights in Nebraska
- recommendations for effective communication and documentation
- promising practices to support victim engagement

Attendees will also hear from Casper Police Department (Wyoming) personnel about their experiences, successes, challenges, and lessons learned over the 4+ years they spent implementing the ELERV Strategy in their jurisdiction.
