Per Nebraska Revised Statute §81-1414.19 (1) and (2), the following letter must be completed, signed, and returned to the Commission for every officer who has, on or after **January 1, 2021**: 1) Voluntarily surrendered their certifications or had their certifications revoked 2) Been convicted of or pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to a felony or a Class 1 misdemeanor; or 3) Upon adjudication by PSAC, been found to have engaged in serious misconduct.

This is the date of the Informal Complaint or notice to the Commission.

Name, rank, and agency at time of the complaint.

Summary of officer conduct, including any criminal charges.

Discipline includes steps taken by the agency, but can also include steps taken by the officer such as retirement and resignation.

Required signature of agency administrator.

Revocation is either: surrendered by the officer (treated the same as being revoked); Contested by officer and revoked by PSAC; or Administratively revoked due to statutory provisions (such as final convictions on felony charges).

Types of certifications that are revoked.

Approval dates. Administrative revocations are not approved by PSAC or the Commission as such a revocation is provided by statute without needing said approvals.

Signed by the Executive Director of the Commission as revocation is a Commission function and not a power of the employing agency.
