Requirements to Attend:

- Have a basic level of physical fitness.
- Must be working within the law enforcement or corrections field.
- Proof that the requesting person has completed a minimum of 40-hours of firearms instructor training. (*Nebraska students' confirmation will be through the state database.*)

- On official agency letterhead, that the requesting person is a firearms instructor or is in the process of being a firearms instructor for the agency. (*Nebraska students' confirmation will be through the state database.*)

A Student will be required to bring the following:

- Clothing and footwear for outdoor and indoor activities. It includes dressing for the weather and having a hydration source.
- Eye and hearing protection for firearms-related training.
- Body armor that covers the chest.
- Student's standard-duty equipment to include: duty belt, belt keepers if used, holster, handgun, minimum of three magazines, and magazine holder. (Bring a spare gun or magazines is optional).
- A training handgun that matches the handgun and fits the holster for work in a classroom.
- 1,000 rounds of ammo for the student's handgun.
- A device that can video record one's actions with playback (could be a cellphone, tablet, etc.).
- A device (laptop or tablet) that allows access to the internet for research and course development.
- Current NLETC screening protocols will be in affect.
