This course provides an overview of hotel and motel interdiction techniques aimed at identifying and disrupting illegal activities such as human trafficking, drug trafficking, and organized criminal operations within those establishments. Participants will learn how to effectively recognize suspicious behavior, conduct investigations, and collaborate with hotel/motel staff and other agencies to address criminal activity. The class also covers legal considerations, the importance of maintaining privacy and confidentiality, and how to engage with hotel and motel management to establish cooperative efforts in crime prevention.

Course Topics Include:

- Identifying different lodging establishments, how they are owned, and how they are operated
- Developing relationships with owners and employees
- Types and indicators of criminal activity associated with hotels, motels, and other lodging establishments
- Commonly used investigative techniques
- Resources available during hotel and motel operations
- Case law relative to hotel and motel investigations and interdiction
