The Statewide Nebraska Victim Advocacy Program (NVAP) is able to assist victims of crime, regardless of location and victimization type, have access to advocacy & direct client assistance in order to work towards or achieve safety & well-being.

The Nebraska Victim Advocacy Program is funded through the Federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Federal Grant dollars.

Services available:

Information & referrals

Personal Advocacy | Accompaniment

Criminal Justice Advocacy

Emotional Support | Safety Services

Assistance with navigating the criminal justice system as a victim | Survivor

Assistance with filing Crime Victim Reparation (CVR) claims

Assisting victims with registration for NEVCAP

Who is eligible?

Any individual whom has been the victim of a crime, regardless of victimization type or location within Nebraska

Eligible Crime Types (not all inclusive list)

- DUI | DWI
- Elder Abuse
- Adult Survivors of incest or child sexual abuse
- Survivors of Homicide Victims
- Robbery
- Assault

NVAP Direct Victim Assistance Fund

Through partnership with the Victim Assistance Division, VOCA (Victims of Crime Act) dollars are available to assist with the following safety & wellbeing needs.

- Relocation for Safety
- Window | Door | Lock replacement or repair & other repairs necessary to ensure victim safety
- Emergency food | Transportation | Clothing | Shelter
- Transportation | Meals | Lodging to participate in the Criminal Justice Process

You May be eligible if:

- The crime occurred in Nebraska
- The need is directly related to the result of a crime
- The need assists in ensuring safety and wellbeing
- The expenses are reasonable

The Direct Victim Assistance Fund is a fund of last resort, therefore unable to assist monetarily for needs that can be met through other sources such as Crime Victims Reparations, DHHS, Medicaid, Etc.

The DVA Fund does not cover property crime, property loss, property damage or pain and suffering.
