## REGULAR MEETING OF THE POLICE STANDARDS ADVISORY COUNCIL March 26, 2025

#### I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman, Chief Steve Reeves called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M. Legal notice of the meeting was published in the Lincoln Journal Star on March 22, 2025. Roll call; Sgt. Drew Bolzer, Chief Paul Graham, Sheriff Greg London, Mr. Matthew McCarthy, Sheriff Dan Osmond, Chief Steve Reeves, Deputy Chief Sherie Thomas. Lt. Col. Jeff Roby and Asst. Chief Jason Stille were absent from the meeting.

#### II. APPROVAL OF FEBRUARY 19, 2025 P.S.A.C. MINUTES

Chief Reeves asked if there was a motion to approve the February 19, 2025 minutes.

### **MOTION**

Sheriff London: I'll make a motion to approve. Mr. McCarthy seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Chief Graham, Sheriff London, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Sgt. Bolzer. Abstained: Deputy Chief Thomas. Motion approved.

#### III. REPORTS

#### A. Director's Report

Director Mark Stephenson reported on the following:

 ARPA Project: Construction began 2 weeks ago on both the North and South sites.

- Instructor Positions: Positions were posted as of March 17, 2025. 6 applications have been received. Interviews have been scheduled. Director Stephenson thanked the PSAC, the Governor's Office and the law enforcement agencies for their support.
- Reciprocity Program: Work is still being done on whether to make changes through Rules and Regulations or a State statute change.
- There are currently 34 applications approved for the 220<sup>th</sup> Basic session. 6
  are in process. Anticipating 40-41 students.

## B. Deputy Director's Report

Deputy Director Gene Boner reported:

- The 219<sup>th</sup> Basic started on January 6, 2025 with 35 students enrolled. Currently there are 33 students enrolled. One student was removed by their agency prior to a test retake and one student voluntarily withdrew.
- The following training was held at NLETC:
  - Criminal Interdiction Training-February 25-27, 2025: 27 students enrolled.
  - o Online Management-March 17-28, 2025 with 14 students enrolled.

## C. Nebraska State Patrol Training Academy

Captain Andy Ecklund reported on the following:

- Camp 71 is currently in week 11 of training. 8 recruits remain enrolled out of the 15 who started the training.
- Captain Ecklund reported on the courses covered and the upcoming courses.
- Camp 72 is currently in the hiring process. Scheduled to begin in July 2025.

## D. Crime Commission Report

Executive Director Bryan Tuma reported the following:

 Statewide Crisis Intervention Program: This is a federal grant of about 4.5 million dollars over a five year period. The focus will be on law enforcement training on use of force, de-escalation, mental health and crisis intervention. A Firearms Use of Force Simulator has been approved for NLETC from this grant. Some of the funds will be used to improve the delivery of the training as continuing education as well as for basic training. Courses could be held at NLETC or regionally.

- Hiring Process: Director Stephenson had reported that the process is under way. Executive Director Tuma thanked the Council for their support..
- Senator Fischer had requested 100 million dollars of federal funding. This
  will not be coming for this year. The money was for the university as well
  as for law enforcement projects.
- There will be some formal complaints served which might result in hearings before the Council.

#### IV. Old Business

### A. Physical Tasks/Change in Curriculum

Director Mark Stephenson reported on the changes made to the physical tasks. A handout was distributed to the Council outlining the requested changes and whether some of the task testing could be in PT gear. 85-87% of the tasks are run at the academies in duty gear. Sheriff London asked if the other academies were on board with the changes. Director Stephenson replied that they were. Sheriff London asked what Director Stephenson needed from the Council. Director Stephenson replied that he would need a motion to approve the change in the curriculum as well as whether some of the tasks could be completed in PT gear.

#### MOTION

Sheriff London: I'll make a motion that we approve the recommended changes by Director Stephenson. Chief Graham seconded the motion.

#### DISCUSSION

Chief Reeves asked when the changes would be come effective. Director Stephenson it would be effective immediately.

Voting in favor: Sheriff London, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Deputy Chief Thomas, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham. Motion approved.

#### V. New Business

### A. Revocation-Voluntary Surrender

Chace Morgan: LR-282-24

Jon Hendricks entered one exhibit. Exhibit 1 is the Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing for Chace Morgan. Chief Reeves accepted the exhibit, and it was entered into the record.

Mr. Henricks provided the factual summary of the details leading up to the revocation. Mr. Hendricks requested that the Council except the relinquishment and recommended that Mr. Morgan's Law Enforcement Officer and Management Certificate be revoked based upon Nebraska Revised Statute 81-1403 Subsection 6(A)(3) due to a misdemeanor conviction that has a rational relation to the officer's fitness and capacity to serve as a law enforcement officer. Also under 81-1403 Subsection 6(C) due to a violation to Mr. Morgan's statutory duties and finally as a violation of his code of ethics.

Chief Reeves asked for a clarification of the date of Mr. Morgan's certification. Mr. Hendricks replied that he was certified August 23, 2019 and he received a management certification in April 21, 2023.

#### MOTION

Deputy Chief Thomas: Based upon the fact that the respondent has signed a Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing and has voluntarily surrendered his certificates, I make a motion that the Council accept the surrender of Chace Morgan's Nebraska Law Enforcement certificate and Management certificate based on the recommendation outlined by Jon Hendricks. Said revocation to be effective upon review and acceptance of the surrender by the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice. Chief Graham seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Deputy Chief Thomas, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham, Sheriff London. Motion approved.
