REGULAR MEETING OF THE POLICE STANDARDS ADVISORY COUNCIL July 17, 2024

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman, Sgt. Drew Bolzer called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M. Legal notice of the meeting was published in the Lincoln Journal Star on July 10, 2024. Roll call; Sgt. Drew Bolzer, Chief Paul Graham, Chief Deputy Greg London, Mr. Matthew McCarthy, Sheriff Dan Osmond, Chief Steve Reeves, Asst. Chief Jason Stille. Lt. Col. Buck Duis and Deputy Chief Sherie Thomas were absent.

II. APPROVAL OF JUNE 26, 2024 P.S.A.C. MINUTES

Sqt. Bolzer asked if there was a motion to approve the June 26, 2024 minutes.

MOTION

Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion to approve. Chief Graham seconded the motion.



III. REPORTS

A. Director's Report

Director Mark Stephenson reported on the following:

The compliance team has completed 11 field audits. There has been an
improvement with compliance, but agencies are still being educated about
the process and documentation. The Compliance Coordinator Kristine
Sabata presented the compliance portion of the Supervision curriculum to
the class, and it was well received.

- There are currently 34 approved packets for the 218th Basic Training session. This includes all 6 from Grand Island P.D. and 1 from Lancaster Co. Sheriff's Office. 6 more packets have been submitted and are being processed for approval. The deadline for approval is July 26th. Since the basic will be starting with 55 there is the possibility that all of Grand Island's students and the one from Lancaster Co. could be enrolled. It all depends on how many packets come in before the deadline.
- There has been an increased number of de-certification investigations. 791's are being processed in the 7-10 day timeframe. They are either being referred for informal complaints or being unlocked. There are currently 20 de-certification cases. Staff Instructor Daron Lindgreen will be assisting Dennis Leonard with investigations.

Sgt. Bolzer asked what documentation was lacking during the audits. Director Stephenson replied with some examples.

B. Deputy Director's Report

Deputy Director Gene Boner reported on the following:

- The 217th Basic is in week 12. 42 students are currently enrolled.
- 4 students failed various portions of the physical task testing. Failure to pass the retake scheduled for July 18th will result in the student being separated from training.
- Advanced Training:
 - o Firearms Instructor Recertification on July 2nd with 14 students.
 - o Patrol Rifle Instructor Recertification on July 3rd with 14 students.
 - Defensive Tactics Instructor Recertification during the week of July 8th with 19 students.
 - Supervision during the week of July 8th with 46 students.
 - o Blue to Gold/Bullet Proof Report Writing on July 9th with 7 students.
 - Blue to Gold/Advanced Search and Seizure on July 10th with 13 students.
 - Online Management on July 8-26th with 13 students.
 - o NCIC on July 15-17th with 36 students.
 - Instructor Development is scheduled for July 29-August 1st with 6 students currently enrolled. The class will be held so an NLETC instructor who needs the course can attend. Applications are still being accepted.

C. Nebraska State Patrol Training Academy

- Lt. Noah McNeese reported on the following:
 - Camp 69 graduated June 14th with 13 recruits.

- The 2024 Junior Law program was conducted the week of June 17th with 28 boys and 30 girls attending.
- Camp 70 began July 8th with 11 recruits. 1 has voluntarily separated.
- The application process for Camp 71 will begin in August with the course starting January 2025.

D. Crime Commission Report

Executive Director Bryan Tuma was absent. Director Mark Stephenson reported that Executive Director Tuma was travelling for the regional meetings on behalf of the Lieutenant Governor. There was no report this month.

 - A. Academy Instructor Requests

Legal Original

Paul Payne-Nebraska State Patrol

After review by the NLETC staff, Deputy Director Boner recommended approval of the Legal academy instructor application as presented in the agenda.

MOTION

Chief Deputy London: I'll make a motion to approve the Legal Original Instructor Application for Paul Payne of the Nebraska State Patrol for the subject areas that are marked approved on the instructor application provided in the agenda packet. Mr. McCarthy seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Chief Deputy London, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Asst. Chief Stille, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham. Motion approved.

B. On-Line Management Mandatory Training

Director Mark Stephenson reported that a Chief of a small agency has failed to complete the online portion of the Management requirement. The Chief has received an extension of the 1-year requirement in 2023. He has been enrolled into 4 sessions of the online training and has failed to complete the course. Director Stephenson was looking for guidance on whether the Chief could be suspended or what other action the Council might recommend.

Director Stephenson also discussed conducting a 3-day in person course at NLETC to cover Title 79 and the other current topics of the online portion of Management. This course would be open to department heads and other designated officers and/or civilian personnel who are working and dealing with issues covered by Title 79. Mr. Stolz described what was covered in his online course and what was expected of the students during the course.

After discussing the issue, the Council recommended sending a letter to the Chief and his city council that he must attend and successfully complete the August 2024 online portion of Management training, or the Council would take action that could include the suspension of his law enforcement certification. No motion was needed.

C. Extension of the 1-year Requirement to Attend Supervision

Jordan Legband-Seward County Sheriff's Office

Director Mark Stephenson reported that Jordan Legband was scheduled to attend the 2024 Supervision course but due to a family issue he wasn't able to attend. Seward County asked for the extension of the 1-year requirement so he can attend the 2025 Supervision course. Director Stephenson recommended the approval of the extension.

MOTION

Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion that we approve the extension provided that he attends the next Management class. Mr. McCarthy seconded the motion.

Sheriff Osmond: Excuse me, Supervision. I amend my motion. Mr. McCarthy seconded the amended motion.

Voting in favor: Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Asst. Chief Stille, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham, Chief Deputy London. Motion approved.
