January 21, 2026**

**I. CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Chief Steve Reeves called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M. Legal notice of the meeting was published in the Lincoln Journal Star on January 14, 2026. Roll call; Sgt. Drew Bolzer, Chief Paul Graham, Sheriff Greg London, Mr. Matthew McCarthy, Sheriff Dan Osmond, Chief Steve Reeves, Lt. Col. Jeff Roby, Deputy Chief Sherie Thomas. Absent from the meeting: Asst. Chief Jason Stille.

**II. APPOINTMENT OF CHAIR**

Chief Reeves entertained a motion for nominations for the 2026 Chairperson.

**MOTION**

**Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion to nominate Chief Paul Graham for Chair of PSAC. Sgt. Bolzer seconded the motion.**

**Voting in favor: Sheriff London, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Deputy Chief Thomas, Sgt. Bolzer. Abstained: Chief Graham. Motion approved.**

**III. NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF VICE CHAIR**

The new Chair, Chief Paul Graham asked if there were nominations for Vice Chair.

**MOTION**

**Sheriff London: I'll make a motion to nominate Lt. Col. Jeff Roby to be our Vice Chair. Mr. McCarthy seconded the motion.**

**Voting in favor: Sheriff London, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Deputy Chief Thomas, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham. Abstained: Lt. Col. Roby. Motion approved.**



#### **IV. APPROVAL OF DECEMBER 2025 MINUTES**

Chief Graham asked if there was a motion to approve the December 17, 2025 minutes.

#### **MOTION**

**Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion to approve the minutes. Sheriff London seconded the motion.**

**Voting in favor: Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham, Sheriff London. Abstained: Deputy Chief Thomas. Motion approved.**

#### **V. REPORTS**

##### **A. Director's Report**

Director Mark Stephenson reported on the following:

- Director Stephenson and Executive Director Tuma traveled to Wayne State College to discuss training opportunities. The Wayne State College team offered assistance with resources and training space and would assist officers with turning their experience and training into credits towards a higher education degree. They will be traveling to Chadron State College on January 28-29<sup>th</sup>.
- Title 79, Chapters 3 and 4: The chapters have been approved and implemented.
- The current basic tested on the JTA Job Tasks. Only one student failed to complete the box. He will retest in week four. The students also completed the PRET test over the course of two days to give the students a better opportunity to score higher due to the time restraints. There were similar results as the testing for the last academy class. Ex: One agency reported their applicant to have a 46" vertical jump. He tested at 26". One agency reported a 300 meter time of 38 seconds. He tested at 56 seconds. The scores haven't been finalized.

##### **B. Deputy Director's Report**

Deputy Director Gene Boner reported:

- The 221<sup>st</sup> Basic Training Session: Graduation was December 18, 2025 with 47 of the original 51 students graduated.

- 222<sup>nd</sup> Basic Training Session: Began on January 5, 2026 with 49 students enrolled. One student was separated due to a medical condition.
- Daily Observation Reports: The DOR's were developed and finalized with input from the instructors. They will be used during the investigative skills scenarios.
- Comprehensive Practical: The comprehensive practical was changed from a pass/fail format to a coaching session. The DOR's will be used to track the student's performance throughout the basic training across all the various skills scenarios.
- MILO/Use of Force Simulator: The new MILO system and portable MILO system have been delivered. Installation of the new system will be during the week of February 16<sup>th</sup> and training for the instructors will be March 3-4<sup>th</sup>. After the training is completed the systems will be available for regional training.
- There were no NLETC hosted specialized courses since the last PSAC meeting.

### **C. Nebraska State Patrol Training Academy**

Lt. Noah McNeese reported on the following:

- Camp 72 graduated on December 19, 2025 in Lincoln with 18 recruits graduating out of 23 who began the training.
- Camp 73 started on January 5, 2026 with 12 recruits. One recruit voluntarily separated from training.
- Inservice training will start in February and run through the second week of June.

### **D. Crime Commission Report**

Executive Director Bryan Tuma reported:

- LEAR payments: The Governor's mid-biennium budget refers specifically to the LEAR payments. It is in the budget to restore 2.5 million dollars in each fiscal year to restore the funding back to 5 million dollars per year. If the legislature approves the budget and the funds are made available, the approved hiring bonuses will be paid first and then the retention bonuses that have been processed. In the next biennium the retention bonuses are

going to go up to 3000 dollars and there are still officers who haven't applied for the tier one bonus.

- We are in the process of renewing the contract with Mr. Hendricks as our Special Assistant Attorney General for handling revocation cases. We've already gotten a letter of appointment by the Attorney General.
- The Ombudsman's office from corrections are forming a committee to study in custody deaths for corrections, county jails and detention facilities. A significant amount of time is spent on mandatory training for jail and detention staff. Division Director Denny Macomber said that Nebraska has a low number of in custody deaths due to negligence.
- LB-150: This bill addresses mental health and expanding services for law enforcement. The preliminary report developed by the Public Policy Center indicates that there will be a jail facility altered to accept Emergency Protective Custody individuals at this time due to the high cost of altering the facility. HHS has agreed to use Opioid Settlement cash funds to build two crisis stabilization centers. These centers will combine local and regional resources to create a facility that would be available for law enforcement officers to take EPC individuals where they can get into the system and receive the proper care.
- Legislature: Director Tuma is tracking various bills that could potentially affect law enforcement and corrections.
  - There is a bill proposing that certain corrections staff could become certified law enforcement officers.
  - LB-784 looks to reduce the number of continuing education hours for law enforcement from 32 to 24 hours and would modify the way mandated topics are tracked
- Accountability Disclosure forms: The financial statement of interest form will need to be completed by Chief Paul Graham as the new incoming Chair. Chief Steve Reeves will also need to complete the form as they are required for one year after serving as Chair.

Sara Bockstadter briefed the Council on the process for appointing a Hearing Officer and the responsibilities of the Hearing Officer pursuant to Title 79,

Chapter 9, Section 011. The Hearing Officer may be the Chair of the Police Standards Advisory Council, or a person designated by the Council. Sara Bockstadter agreed to serve as the Hearing Officer if the Council wished her to.

### **MOTION**

**Sheriff London: I will make a motion that Sara Bockstadter will be our Hearing Officer for 2026. Deputy Chief Thomas seconded the motion.**

**Voting in favor: Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Deputy Chief Thomas, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham, Sheriff London, Mr. McCarthy. Motion approved.**

**Chief Graham moved item C up in the agenda.**

#### **C. Revocation: Voluntary Surrender**

Grant Gentile: LR-202-21

Special Assistant Attorney General Jon Hendricks entered one exhibit. Exhibit 1 is the Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing for Grant Gentile. Chief Graham accepted the exhibit and it was entered into the record.

Mr. Hendricks provided the factual summary of the details leading up to the revocation. Mr. Hendricks requested that the Council accept the relinquishment and recommended that Mr. Gentile's law enforcement certificate be revoked based on his signed voluntary relinquishment.

### **MOTION**

**Sheriff London: I'll make a motion. Based upon the fact that the respondent has signed a Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing and has voluntarily surrendered his certificate, I make a motion that the Council accept the surrender of Grant Gentile's Nebraska law enforcement certificate based on the recommendation outlined by Jon Hendricks. Said revocation to be effective upon review and acceptance of the surrender by the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice. Lt. Col. Roby seconded the motion.**

**Voting in favor: Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham, Sheriff London, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond. Abstained: Deputy Chief Thomas. Motion approved.**

Jessica Wagoner reported that the agencies listed above failed to report Continuing Education prior to January 7, 2026. It is a voting item for the Council to decide if it will impose a one hundred dollar per day fine for not being in compliance. Sheriff London asked if Director Stephenson had a recommendation. Director Stephenson responded that the agencies receive multiple notices and would be in agreement with whatever the Council decided. Jessica Wagoner stated that the fine would be one hundred dollars a day starting on January 8<sup>th</sup>. As of the 20<sup>th</sup> of January all of the agencies are in compliance.

**MOTION**

**Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion that we enforce the fine of one hundred dollars per day for these agencies that can't get their stuff completed. Sgt. Bolzer seconded the motion.**

**DISCUSSION**

Sara Bockstadter pointed out that the statute states that the fine will be one hundred dollars per day but not to exceed a maximum of five hundred dollars. Sara Bockstadter recommended that Sheriff Osmond amend his motion to show the cap of five hundred dollars.

**AMENDED MOTION**

**Sheriff Osmond: I will amend my motion to cap the fine at five hundred dollars to align with statute. Sgt. Bolzer seconded the amended motion.**

## **DISCUSSION**

Sara Bockstadter did find and present what happens if the fine is not paid. Any administrative fine imposed under the section being discussed that authorizes a fine, shall constitute a debt to the State of Nebraska which may be collected by lien, foreclosure or suit to recover by the Office of the Attorney General in the name of the State of Nebraska in the district court of the county where the final agency action was taken. All fines imposed by the Council shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for distribution in accordance with the State constitution. It is in 81-1403 in the last section of that statute.
