## REGULAR MEETING OF THE POLICE STANDARDS ADVISORY COUNCIL February 18, 2026

### I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Chief Paul Graham called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M. Legal notice of the meeting was published in the Lincoln Journal Star on February 11, 2026. Roll call; Sgt. Drew Bolzer, Chief Paul Graham, Sheriff Greg London, Mr. Matthew McCarthy, Sheriff Dan Osmond, Chief Steve Reeves, Asst. Chief Jason Stille. Absent from the meeting: Lt. Col. Jeff Roby and Deputy Chief Sherie Thomas.

### II. APPROVAL OF JANUARY 21, 2026 P.S.A.C. MINUTES

#### MOTION

**Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion to approve the minutes. Mr. McCarthy seconded the motion.**

**Voting in favor: Chief Graham, Sheriff London, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Sgt. Bolzer. Abstained: Asst. Chief Stille. Motion approved.**

### III. REPORTS

#### A. Director's Report

Director Mark Stephenson reported on the following:

- As of February 18, 2026 five new 791 complaints have been received for investigation.
- Staff Instructor Mike Kerby inspected the new "Tac House" which is under construction. Mr. Kerby commented that the office space, classrooms and conference room are ideal for NLETC's mission and that the search areas will be ideal for building search and active shooter training.
- Metro Community College Zoom Meeting: Director Stephenson had a zoom meeting with the college on February 17, 2026. The college requested input from Director Stephenson regarding their new law

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enforcement training facility. Stage One of their plan is to expand their current training for those interested in a career in law enforcement and Stage Two would be to provide continuing education facilities for law enforcement.

- Angelica Escobedo was introduced as the new Compliance Coordinator. She took Kristine Sabata's position.

## **B. Deputy Director's Report**

Deputy Director Gene Boner reported:

- The 222<sup>nd</sup> Basic Training Session: The class is in week seven with 47 students currently enrolled.
- Rachel Kohlman conducted training in Lyons Nebraska on February 11<sup>th</sup>. The 8 hour training consisted of de-escalation, stress management and mental health. 28 students attended the training. The evaluations received were very positive.
- No advanced courses were conducted since the January PSAC meeting.
- Supervision will be held February 24-26<sup>th</sup> with 39 students enrolled. There will be an additional Supervision course in October.
- Management training is scheduled for June 2026 and November 2026.
- NLETC Staff Instructor Pat Benson has medically retired as of February 6<sup>th</sup>. He is currently on family medical leave.

Sheriff Osmond asked how the new physical task testing went for the current basic. Deputy Director Boner responded that one person failed to complete the box obstacle in the week one test but was able to complete the task at the week four retest.

## **C. Nebraska State Patrol Training Academy**

Sgt. Clayton Dishong reported on the following:

- Camp 73 is in the 6<sup>th</sup> week of training with 10 recruits remaining from the original 12 that started. Sgt. Dishong reported on the recent and future courses scheduled to be completed.
- Inservice training started the week of February 17<sup>th</sup> and will conclude on June 11<sup>th</sup>.

## D. Crime Commission Report

Executive Director Bryan Tuma reported:

- Weysan Dunn's wife recently passed away unexpectedly. Mr. Dunn has been a member of the Crime Commission for a number of years.
- LB-150: The original intent of the legislation was to look into an existing jail facility and they would do some tweaking to that facility so it can be a reception point for EPCs. This proved to not be feasible due to costs involved. There is a federal money available for a rural health initiative That money will be used to build two new crisis stabilization centers in Nebraska. One in South Sioux City and the other in Kimball. Executive Director Tuma reported on Ride Care. Ride Care is a 3<sup>rd</sup> party vendor that provides transportation services for people who are in crisis. Agencies could utilize that resource to transport people for treatment, which would be a relief in terms of cost and personnel issues.
- Jail Standards Conference: It is scheduled for April 1-3 in Kearney. The Jail Standards board will have their meeting on Friday the 3<sup>rd</sup>. The conference is an outstanding training opportunity for correctional staff and sheriffs or jail administrators.
- Appropriations Committee: We met them last Wednesday. Provided our testimony on the Crime Commission. A 2.5 million dollar increase in each year for the LEAR payments has been approved by the committee. If approved by the Governor payments will resume. The committee also approved an adjustment to the personal service limitation (budget used to pay wages and salary). The adjusted amount is 250,000 for this year and 300,000 for the next fiscal year.
- Proposed cuts: March 27<sup>th</sup> is the last date to submit budget changes. The legislature has to have the budget addressed and signed by the Governor by the 50<sup>th</sup> day of the session. Executive Director Tuma reported that the Commission is closely monitoring spending to determine what funds will be available to get to the end of the current fiscal year.

Sheriff London asked if Executive Director Tuma knew when the hiring bonus and retention bonuses are going to be restarted.

Mr. Tuma responded that the appropriation committee has been meeting and reviewing the budget submittals from all the agencies. They approved three items; the LEAR funds, PSL issue and one other item. If approved it will probably be in May.

Chief Graham asked if applications were still being accepted. Executive Director Tuma replied that people could still apply but once the budget number are known there will be discussions. It is unknown at this time if the funding appropriated will be enough to cover LEAR and Hiring Bonuses.

#### **IV. OLD BUSINESS**

##### **1. Continuing Education and Firearms Qualification Violation Fees**

Jessica Wagoner reported that after sending out the agency fine letters for failure to report continuing education or firearms qualification that some agencies that were fined had received an email from NLETC that they had completed the reporting requirements. The fine invoices for those agencies were voided. New processes will be implemented so this does not occur again.

Chief Reeves asked if NLETC enters firearms qualifications for someone who attends an instructor course. Director Stephenson replied that NLETC does not enter firearms qualifications. NLETC does not have access to the agencies reporting site on INFORMA.

Sheriff London asked if any of the fined agencies had paid the fine. Jessica Wagoner responded that all but two of them have paid.

##### **2. Academy Inspection: Omaha Police Department**

Jessica Wagoner reported that on January 20, 2026 Omaha Police Department submitted the remaining documents to complete the yearly inspection. Jessica Wagoner recommended that approval be granted for the Omaha Police Department Academy.

and Waiver of Notice and Hearing for Chad Kavars. Chief Graham accepted the exhibit and it was entered into the record.

Mr. Hendricks provided the factual summary of the details leading up to the revocation. Mr. Hendricks requested that the Council accept the relinquishment and recommended that Mr. Kavar's law enforcement officer certificate be revoked upon his signed voluntary surrender.


