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COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE

REGULAR MEETING OF THE POLICE STANDARDS ADVISORY COUNCIL April 16, 2025

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman, Chief Steve Reeves called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M. Legal notice of the meeting was published in the Lincoln Journal Star on April 9, 2025. Roll call; Chief Paul Graham, Mr. Matthew McCarthy, Sheriff Dan Osmond, Chief Steve Reeves, Lt. Col. Jeff Roby, Asst. Chief Jason Stille, Deputy Chief Sherie Thomas. Sgt. Drew Bolzer and Sheriff Greg London were absent from the meeting.

II. APPROVAL OF MARCH 26, 2025 P.S.A.C. MINUTES

Chief Reeves entertained a motion to approve the March 26, 2025 PSAC minutes.

MOTION

Mr. McCarthy: So moved. Chief Graham seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Deputy Chief Thomas, Chief Graham. Abstained: Asst. Chief Stille. Motion approved.

III. REPORTS

A. Director's Report

Director Mark Stephenson reported on the following:

ARPA Project: Scheduling is on track for the construction project.



- Instructor Positions: 3 instructors have been hired. 2 will begin in April and 1 will begin in May.
- There has been an increase in the number of Change in Status forms reflecting a 791 or misconduct issue. Approximately 3 new informal complaints were received in the first week of April.
- The process to find a vendor for the next job task analysis is underway. IO Solutions has submitted their proposals. DAS Procurement is involved to ensure the process is a smooth as possible.

B. Deputy Director's Report

Deputy Director Gene Boner reported:

- The 219th Basic will graduate on April 17, 2025. 32 students will be graduating. 1 student will be recycling in the next basic training session for the patrol rifle training.
- The 220th Basic will be starting on April 28, 2025. 49 students are enrolled.
- The following training was held at NLETC:
 - o Intermediate Crash Investigation: March 31-April 4, 2025 with 20 students enrolled.
 - o Firearms Instructor: March 31-April 4, 2025 with 16 students enrolled.
 - Defensive Tactics Instructor Recertification: April 2-4, 2025 with 5 students enrolled.

C. Nebraska State Patrol Training Academy

Captain Andy Ecklund reported on the following:

- Camp 71 is currently in week 14 of training. 8 recruits remain enrolled out of the 15 who started the training.
- Captain Ecklund reported on the courses covered and the upcoming courses.
- Camp 72 is currently in the hiring process. Scheduled to begin in July 2025.

D. Crime Commission Report

Executive Director Bryan Tuma reported the following:

- The next Crime Commission meeting is scheduled for May 16, 2025. There are several revocation issues and dismissals on the agenda.
- The Jail Standards Conference is this week in Kearney. Correctional staff training is being provided.
- Grants: There is uncertainty regarding the availability of federal grants.
 The grants are being reviewed before money is received in the next grant cycle.
- A team from the National Criminal Justice Association held two recent meetings in Nebraska. There were two meetings in Lincoln and two meetings in North Platte. This was in response to the stakeholder survey that was sent out last year to determine funding issues that the agencies want to see addressed.
- The Burn/Jag Grant will be approximately 1.6 million dollars. Which would be spread pretty thin to address all of the issues that are needed. SCIP (State Crisis Intervention Program) grant will benefit the probation system for some upgrades to their data management systems. The project would receive approximately 1 million dollars over two years.
- Measures for Justice are targeting prosecutor offices, trying to look at their data systems and how they share data with the criminal justice agencies.
 Nebraska was asked to be the pilot state for the program.
- The Crime Commission offices in the State Office building are going to be remodeled with new paint and carpet. During that process the offices will be temporarily displaced and spread out to other offices in the State Office building.

IV. Old Business

A. Reciprocity Proposal

Director Mark Stephenson provided handouts outlining the proposed changes to the reciprocity program prior to the meeting. The handout represented the proposed changes in requirements previously discussed along with a plan for implementation of the changes. This will require a change in Rules and Regulations. After some discussion, Agency Counsel Bockstadter recommended

bringing updated Rules and Regulations to the Council for approval at the May 2025 meeting. No action was taken at this time.

V. New Business

A. Revocation-Voluntary Surrender

Nicholas Conger: LR-301-25

Jon Hendricks entered one exhibit. Exhibit 1 is the Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing for Nicholas Conger. Chief Reeves accepted the exhibit, and it was entered into the record.

Mr. Hendricks provided the factual summary of the details leading up to the revocation. Mr. Hendricks requested that the Council except the relinquishment and recommended that Mr. Conger's Law Enforcement Officer Certificate be revoked based upon Title 79, Chapter 9 of the Nebraska Administrative Code, subsection 004.02, due to willfully providing false information in connection with obtaining certification or obtaining certification status.

MOTION

Sheriff Osmond: Based upon the fact that the respondent has signed a Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing and has voluntarily surrendered his certificate, I make a motion that the Council accept the surrender of Nicholas Conger's Nebraska Law Enforcement certificate based on the recommendation outlined by Jon Hendricks. Said revocation to be effective upon review and acceptance of the surrender by the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice. Chief Graham seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Asst. Chief Stille, Deputy Chief Thomas, Chief Graham, Mr. McCarthy. Abstained: Lt. Col. Roby. Motion approved.

B. OPD Request to use the IO Solutions Test In-Lieu-Of the TABE Test

Director Mark Stephenson reported that the Omaha Police Department Academy has requested to use their IO Solutions Entrance Exam in-lieu-of the TABE test. The IO Solutions test consists of 200 questions. The IO Solutions test specifically tests reading and comprehension at the 11th grade level. Then there are the integrity and cognitive questions which are based on certain skill sets that are predictive of a person's ability to do the law enforcement job. The one rule and regulations difference between the IO Solutions test and the TABE test is the writing. The rules and regulations say test for reading, writing and comprehension at an 11th grade level. The TABE test has a writing section where the person taking the test is given a paragraph or sentence and has to pick out

the grammatical, spelling, and formatting errors. Even though the writing is tested with the TABE test, the results are not translated to the student's report writing etc. in the academy. IO Solutions is also a company that would be designing an entrance exam with the job task analysis if they receive the contract for that process. Director Stephenson's only concern was whether NLETC would be responsible for proctoring multiple PSAC approved exams. Lt. Col. Roby asked if there was any discussion with IO Solutions regarding the missing writing element. Deputy Chief Thomas replied that they did not. Director Stephenson commented that during previous discussions regarding the TABE test it was brought up that a high school diploma was a requirement for certification, or they had a college degree, so why was an additional test needed. Sheriff Osmond recommended allowing OPD to use the IO Solutions test to get information on the correlation of those passing the entrance test and being able to successfully complete the basic training academics. Mr. McCarthy voiced his concern with the IO test not having a writing portion. Currently at the college level they are having to teach lower level English classes to incoming freshmen do to them not having the basic writing skills that they should have received in high school. Sheriff Osmond commented that this agenda item is specific to Omaha Police Department and is not opening up approval for multiple agencies to develop their own tests.

MOTION

Sheriff Osmond: I would make the motion that we allow the Omaha Police Department to use the IO test for their entrance testing. No time limit on it. They continue to use it for as long as we grant it, for the rest of their testing processes in 2025 and it could be renewed after that. Mr. McCarthy seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Asst. Chief Stille, Chief Graham, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond. Abstained: Deputy Chief Thomas. Motion approved.

The Council took a break from 10:08 a.m. to 10:20 a.m.

C. Management In-Lieu-Of NLETC Course

Kory Gurzick-Douglas County Sheriff's Office

Director Mark Stephenson reported that Lieutenant Gurzick has completed the Background for Police Applicants, instructed by the Omaha Police Department consisting of 12 hours, the FBI-LEEDA Executive Leadership course consisting of 28 hours, the FBI-LEEDA Command Leadership course consisting of 28 hours, and the Police One course on Social Media and Law Enforcement consisting of 1 hour. All management core topics were met. Director Stephenson recommended that the Council approve the request for the waiver to attending

the NLETC in-person management course with the provision they complete the online management course.

MOTION

Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion that we grant the waiver of management inlieu-of NLETC management provided that the online management course is completed on the next available time. Chief Graham seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Lt. Col. Roby, Asst. Chief Stille, Deputy Chief Thomas, Chief Graham, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves. Motion approved.

D. Supervision In-Lieu-Of NLETC Course

Steven Durow-Douglas County Sheriff's Office

Director Mark Stephenson reported that Sgt. Durow completed the PSAC approved Douglas County Sheriff's Office Line Supervisor course. All supervision core topics were met. Director Stephenson recommended that the Council approve the request for in-lieu-of training for Sgt. Durow.

MOTION

Chief Graham: I'll make a motion to approve the waiver supervision in-lieu-of the NLETC supervision course for Steven Durow of the Douglas County Sheriff's Office. Sheriff Osmond seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Asst. Chief Stille, Deputy Chief Thomas, Chief Graham, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby. Motion approved.

E. Extension of the 1-year Requirement for Management Training

Daniel Flores-Morrill County Sheriff's Office

Director Mark Stephenson reported that Chief Deputy Flores has attended the NLETC in-person management course and is requesting an extension to complete the on-line portion of the management course. Director Stephenson recommended that the Council approve Chief Deputy Flores' request.

MOTION

Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion that we grant the extension of the 1-year requirement for Chief Deputy Flores. Mr. McCarthy seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Deputy Chief Thomas, Chief Graham, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Asst. Chief Stille. Motion approved.
