**REGULAR MEETING OF THE
POLICE STANDARDS ADVISORY COUNCIL
April 15, 2026**

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Chief Paul Graham called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M. Legal notice of the meeting was published in the Lincoln Journal Star on April 8, 2026. Roll call; Sgt. Drew Bolzer, Chief Paul Graham, Sheriff Greg London, Mr. Matthew McCarthy, Sheriff Dan Osmond, Chief Steve Reeves, Asst. Chief Jason Stille. Absent from the meeting: Lt. Col. Jeff Roby and Deputy Chief Sherie Thomas.

II. APPROVAL OF MARCH 18, 2026 P.S.A.C. MINUTES

MOTION

Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion to approve the minutes. Chief Reeves seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Chief Graham, Sheriff London, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Sgt. Bolzer. Abstained: Asst. Chief Stille. Motion approved.

III. REPORTS

A. Director's Report

Director Mark Stephenson reported on the following:

- 223rd Basic: At the deadline of April 3rd 49 completed applications have been received. 2 applications were received after the deadline and they will be bumped to the 224th Basic.
- Peru State College Visit: April 9, 2026 travelled to Peru State College to meet with their Corrections Leadership Academy. The meeting was to continue building relationships with the Nebraska Colleges who are interested in helping provide training to law enforcement.
- Construction Project: Potentially will be taking possession of the new buildings early.



B. Deputy Director's Report

Deputy Director Gene Boner reported:

- The 222nd Basic Training Session: 45 students are still enrolled. Graduation is set for April 23rd at 11:00 a.m. Completed the comprehensive practical coaching day on April 14th.
- Specialized Courses:
 - Intermediate Crash Investigation: April 6-10, 2026 with 9 students enrolled.
 - Firearms Instructor: April 6-10, 2026 with 18 students enrolled.
 - PPCT Defensive Ground Control Instructor: April 9-10, 2026 with 8 students enrolled.
 - PPCT Defensive Tactics Instructor Recertification: April 6-8, 2026 with 10 students enrolled.
 - Criminal Interdiction: April 14-16, 2026 with 21 students enrolled.
 - Online Management: April 6-24, 2026 with 15 students enrolled.

C. Nebraska State Patrol Training Academy

Lt. Noah McNeese reported on the following:

- Camp 73 is at the halfway point of training with 8 recruits remaining from the original 12 that started. Lt. McNeese reported on the recent and future courses scheduled to be completed.
- Inservice: Centralized inservice is currently being held. 390 officers will be attending.
- The initial application process for Camp 74 has been completed. The camp will start in July 2026. 196 applications were initially received. Automatic disqualifiers dropped the number down to 170.

D. Crime Commission Report

Executive Director Bryan Tuma reported:

- LB-150: LB-150 was a legislative initiative passed in the last session. The Crime Commission's assignment was to look at mental health resources for law enforcement across the state. One of the ideas that was proposed from that legislation was looking at an existing jail facility that might be converted or modified so it could be a reception point for Emergency Protective Custody people. The Attorney General will be briefed with the final report as he was the primary sponsor for the bill. Two Crisis Stabilization centers are currently under construction. One will be in South Sioux City and the other will be in Kimball. Those will be reception facilities for EPC people. There will also be funding available to sponsor crisis intervention training. That includes the five day course and a two day beta course. We're going to work with our State college partners and others to look at how we make that training available with minimal travel costs for law enforcement. They are looking at contracting with a third party vendor to provide transportation for people that are in crisis to a mental health facility for treatment. The funding has been paid through DHHS from the Rural Health Initiative.
- Budget: The legislature adjourns on Friday. The two big budget bills did pass.
 - The Crime Commission consolidated five of the eleven different programs for greater flexibility in the budget.
 - The LEAR payment amount was adjusted to five million dollars for both the current fiscal year as well as the next fiscal year that begins on July 1, 2026. Once the funds are made available, payments on the LEAR program will resume.
 - There are plans to look at the filling of the additional instructor vacancies.
- Retirement: Executive Director Tuma will be retiring on June 5, 2026. There will be an interim director identified until the vetting process is completed for a new Executive Director.

Members of the Council thanked Executive Director Tuma for his service to law enforcement and the State of Nebraska.

Sheriff London enquired about the Hiring Bonuses. Executive Director Tuma responded that depending on the funds available after the LEAR payments that the bonuses should be granted for those that applied for the last two basic sessions and then there will need to be a discussion going forward.

V. NEW BUSINESS

A. Revocation: Voluntary Surrender

Jonathan Sears: LR-332-26

Special Assistant Attorney General Jon Hendricks entered one exhibit. Exhibit 1 is the Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing for Jonathan Sears. Chief Graham accepted the exhibit and it was entered into the record.

Mr. Hendricks provided the factual summary of the details leading up to the revocation. Mr. Hendricks requested that the Council accept the relinquishment and recommended that Mr. Sears' Law Enforcement Certificates be revoked based upon his signed voluntary surrender.

MOTION

Sheriff Osmond: Based upon the fact that the respondent has signed a Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing, and has voluntarily surrendered his certificates, I make a motion that the Council accept the surrender of Jonathan Sears' Nebraska Law Enforcement certificate and Supervision certificate based on the recommendation outlined by Jon Hendricks. Said revocation to be effective upon review and acceptance of his surrender by the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice. Mr. McCarthy seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Sheriff London, Mr. McCarthy, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham. Abstained: Asst. Chief Stille. Motion approved.

1 **B. Revocation**

2 Dominick Peterson: LR-307-25

3 **CHAIR:** This revocation hearing before the Police Standards Advisory Council in
4 the matter of State of Nebraska v. Dominick Peterson, Case Number LR-
5 307-25 is called to order. The date is April 15, 2026 and the time is 9:18
6 a.m.

7 **CHAIR:** I will note the following Council members are present;
8 Myself, Chief Paul Graham-Aurora Police Department, Sgt. Drew Bolzer-
9 Lancaster County Sheriff's Office, Sheriff Greg London-Sarpy County
10 Sheriff's Office, Mr. Matthew McCarthy-representing the public at large,
11 Sheriff Dan Osmond-Custer County Sheriff's Office, Chief Steve Reeves-
12 North Platte Police Department, Asst. Chief Stille-Lincoln Police
13 Department. I will note the following Council members are not present; Lt.
14 Col. Jeff Roby-Nebraska State Patrol and Deputy Chief Sherie Thomas-
15 Omaha Police Department.

16 **CHAIR:** I will note that there is a quorum of the Council present, so this hearing
17 may proceed. Attorney Sara Bockstadter is here as legal advisor to the
18 Council. The Council will hear this matter pursuant to Nebraska Revised
19 Statute §81-1403, and Title 79 of the Nebraska Administrative Code,
20 Chapter 9, Revocation of Law Enforcement Officer's Certification.

21 **CHAIR:** In this case, the complainant has filed a formal revocation complaint
22 against Dominick Peterson, the respondent officer. The allegations for
23 revocation are contained in the complaint filed by the State of Nebraska,
24 on or about February 18, 2026. No answer has been filed by the

25 respondent officer. Special Assistant Attorney General, Jonathan
26 Hendricks appears on behalf of the State.

27 **CHAIR:** Dominick Peterson is not present and there is no Counsel representing
28 him. All right. The Police Standards Advisory Council shall act as the
29 Hearing Board for this appeal. Neither I, nor the other Council members
30 will be a witness for either side and I am not aware of any matter which I
31 believe, may be grounds for challenge by either side against me or the
32 Council members. Does any Council member have any personal
33 knowledge of this case? If so, please explain.

34 **CHAIR:** Drew?

35 **BOLZER:** No.

36 **CHAIR:** Greg?

37 **LONDON:** No.

38 **OSMOND:** No.

39 **McCARTHY:** No.

40 **CHAIR:** Steve?

41 **REEVES:** No.

42 **STILLE:** No.

43 **CHAIR:** Nor myself. All right. Mr. Hendricks, the State may proceed with the
44 opening, with it's opening statement at this time.

45 **HENDRICKS:** I will waive opening statement and just go to offering a closing statement
46 to recap the basis of the case.

47 **CHAIR:** Ok. You may proceed with your case. Do you have any exhibits you
48 which to offer or present at this time?

49 **HENDRICKS:** Yes. May I approach?

50 **CHAIR:** Yes.

51 **HENDRICKS:** I would offer exhibit number one which is the complaint for revocation of
52 law enforcement officer certification for Dominick Peterson. This is the
53 complaint that was filed on February 18th of 2026. It does include sub-
54 exhibits 1A through 1J which were included with the original complaint.

55 **CHAIR:** Ok. Exhibits 1, 1A through 1J are, have been received.

56 **HENDRICKS:** I'm offering exhibit two which is the investigator report of Gary Reed
57 regarding Dominick Peterson.

58 **CHAIR:** Exhibit 2 is received.

59 **HENDRICKS:** And lastly I'm offering exhibit number three, which is the letter that was
60 sent to Mr. Peterson by certified mail notifying him about today's hearing.
61 Also, the final page is a certified mail receipt.

62 **CHAIR:** Exhibit 3 is received.

63 **HENDRICKS:** That is the evidence that the State is offering.

64 **CHAIR:** Ok. Do you have any other witness to testify?

65 **HENDRICKS:** No.

66 **CHAIR:** Ok.

67 **CHAIR:** Does the State have any other further evidence?

68 **HENDRICKS:** Nothing further for evidence.

69 **CHAIR:** Ok. Mr. Hendricks, does the State wish to make any closing statements?

70 **HENDRICKS:** Yes. I'll give a synopsis of what the State's evidence shows in the exhibits
71 submitted to the Council today. Mr. Peterson was awarded a law
72 enforcement officer certification in September of 2002. He was awarded a
73 supervisor law enforcement certification in February of 2010 and he was
74 awarded a management law enforcement certification in March of 2025.

75 At all pertinent times Mr. Peterson was employed as a law enforcement
76 officer in the State of Nebraska. He had worked at the Lyons Police
77 Department, Hemingford Police Department, Box Butte Sheriff's Office,
78 Scottsbluff Police Department and the Scotts Bluff County Sheriff's Office.
79 His last employment was at the Mitchell Police Department from March of
80 2023 to April of 2025. The State's evidence shows in exhibits offered
81 today that around April 2024, the respondent had sent friend requests to
82 a Ms. Taylor Vance on her social media accounts, such as Facebook and
83 Snap Chat. At the time, Mr. Peterson was employed as the Chief of
84 Police for Mitchell Police Department. Ms. Vance was a volunteer
85 firefighter and a special education teacher at a local school. According to
86 testimony that would later come from Taylor Vance, Mr. Peterson's
87 messages to her soon became sexual in nature. Uninvited, with Mr.
88 Peterson sending pictures of himself with his shirt off, in the shower,
89 photos of his groin area with clothing on. According to Ms. Vance Mr.
90 Peterson sent messages asking her to send nude photos which she
91 declined. Ms. Vance would go on to testify that she and her boyfriend
92 repeatedly asked Mr. Peterson to stop communicating with her but Mr.
93 Peterson continued messaging her for months. At times he would send
94 over twenty messages a day to Ms. Vance and at times the messages
95 would be sent late at night, after midnight. Ms. Vance would later testify
96 that Mr. Peterson began driving by her home and on one occasion where
97 Mr. Peterson had driven by and noticed her boyfriend was present, that
98 he messaged her and he propositioned her to come to his home to spend
99 the night. Ms. Vance then filed for a protection order in Scotts Bluff

100 County District Court. The filing occurred initially on August 7th of 2024
101 and went to a hearing in 2025. On April 3rd of 2025 the Scotts Bluff District
102 Court entered an order finding that Mr. Peterson had engaged in a
103 knowing and willful course of conduct toward Ms. Vance which seriously
104 terrified, threatened or intimidated her and which served no legitimate
105 purpose thus granting the harassment protection order against the
106 respondent. And that court case and the judge's decision is in the packet,
107 exhibit 1F. Mr. Peterson appealed that Scotts Bluff County District Court
108 decision to grant a protection order against him to the Nebraska Court of
109 Appeals. On January 20th of 2026, the Nebraska Court of Appeals issued
110 its opinion which affirmed the ruling of the Scotts Bluff District Court
111 finding the harassment order had been properly granted and that Court of
112 Appeals certified copy of their decision is in the packet in exhibit 1J. I've
113 given an overview of the conduct. More detail about the conduct is set out
114 in those documents from the court decision which again is 1F, the Court
115 of Appeals decision which is 1J and it is summarized by the investigator
116 report which is exhibit 2. The Law Enforcement Training Center received
117 a change in status form regarding Mr. Peterson from the Mitchell Police
118 Department dated on April 15th 2025, indicating that Mr. Peterson had
119 been terminated from his employment on April 14th of 2025. An informal
120 complaint was filed on April 21st 2025. Notice was provided by the
121 Executive Director to Mr. Peterson the following day. In July of 2025 the
122 Executive Director sent a letter to the respondent, Mr. Peterson,
123 indicating that a formal revocation would be pursued and then on
124 February 28th of 2026, a complaint was filed and a letter with today's

125 hearing and the complaint was mailed to Mr. Peterson and was obtained
126 by him by certified mail which is set forth in exhibit 3. I would that you vote
127 to recommend that Mr. Peterson's law enforcement certificates be
128 revoked on the basis that his conduct violated his law enforcement officer
129 oath of office, code of ethics and his statutory duties.

130 **LONDON:** Based on clear and convincing evidence presented at the hearing today
131 in case number LR-307-25, and the fact that the respondent was duly
132 notified and failed to appear before the Police Standards Advisory
133 Council, I hereby move that the Council revoke Dominick Peterson's
134 Nebraska law enforcement officer certification, supervisor certification and
135 management certification. Said revocation effective upon the review and
136 approval of the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal
137 Justice.

138 **CHAIR:** Is there a second?

139 **BOLZER:** I'll second.

140 **CHAIR:** Drew second. Discussion? Roll call vote.

141 **GOBEL:** Mr. McCarthy?

156 **CHAIR:** All right. The motion to revoke the respondent's law enforcement officer
157 certificates has been sustained and now will be forwarded along with the
158 findings of facts and conclusions to the Nebraska Commission on Law
159 Enforcement and Criminal Justice for final action at a subsequent public
160 hearing. The date is contingent upon preparation of the findings and the
161 review and approval by this body. I would anticipate the Crime
162 Commission will receive this at it's next quarterly meeting in Lincoln on
163 May 15, 2026.

164 **CHAIR:** Does anyone else have any questions or any comments? All right. The
165 hearing is concluded. The time is 9:30 a.m.

C. Extension of 1 Year Requirement for Management

Caleb Scott: Banner County Sheriff's Office

Director Mark Stephenson reported that Chief Deputy Caleb Scott of the Banner County Sheriff's Office is scheduled for the June 2026 NLETC management course and the online management course in August of 2026. He was promoted August 1, 2025 so he will not be able to complete the training prior to the end of his 1-year requirement. Director Stephenson recommended the approval of the extension.

MOTION

Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion to approve the extension of the 1-year requirement for attending management training for Caleb Scott of the Banner County Sheriff's Office. Mr. McCarthy seconded the motion.


