REGULAR MEETING OF THE

May 21, 2025

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman, Chief Steve Reeves called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M. Legal notice of the meeting was published in the Lincoln Journal Star on May 14, 2025. Roll call; Sgt. Drew Bolzer, Chief Paul Graham, Sheriff Greg London, Sheriff Dan Osmond, Chief Steve Reeves, Lt. Col. Jeff Roby, Asst. Chief Jason Stille. Mr. Matthew McCarthy and Deputy Chief Sherie Thomas were absent from the meeting.

II. APPROVAL OF APRIL 16, 2025 P.S.A.C. MINUTES

Chief Reeves entertained a motion to approve the April 16, 2025 PSAC minutes.

MOTION

Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion to approve with one correction. Page 5, the motion for the Omaha Police Department to use the testing was by me and not Chief Graham. Chief Graham seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Chief Graham, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Asst. Chief Stille. Abstained: Sgt. Bolzer and Sheriff London. Motion approved.

III. REPORTS

A. Director's Report

Director Mark Stephenson reported on the following:

- NLETC has received 11 new applications for agency accreditation. Approximately 90 agencies in the state have applied for accreditation. Initial agency accreditation will expire in January 2026. Director Stephenson asked the Crime Commission for guidance on auditing the agency accreditation since they all expire at the same time. Director Stephenson recommended treating them the same as the Continuing Education audits. That process will begin in January 2026



- Tier 2 retention payments will open in June 2025. Information will be sent out to the agencies.

B. Deputy Director's Report

Deputy Director Gene Boner reported:

- Introduced 3 new instructors. Tyler Hinchey came from the Aurora Police Department, Brandon Riley came from the Grand Island Police Department and Gary Reed came over from the Adams County Sheriff's Office. Deputy Director Boner briefed the Council on their instructing duties and experience.
- The 220th Basic started on April 28, 2025 with 48 students enrolled. Currently there are 43 enrolled. The recently approved physical task testing was completed in week one of training with all students passing.
- The following training was held at NLETC:
 - Tactical Deployment Dog Seminar: April 21, 2025 with 9 attendees.
 - Advanced Crash Investigation: May 5-9, 2025 with 12 attendees.
 - Firearms Instructor Recertification: May 6, 2025 with 19 attendees.
 - Patrol Rifle Instructor Recertification: May 7, 2025 with 17 attendees.
 - Basic Jail Training: May 12-23, 2025 with 21 attendees.
 - Patrol Rifle Instructor: May 12-16, 2025 with 13 attendees.
 - Defensive Tactics Instructor: May 19-23, 2025 with 11 attendees.

C. Nebraska State Patrol Training Academy (Crime Commission report was moved ahead of the NSP report.)

Sgt. Nick Plate reported on the following:

- Camp 71 is currently in week 19 of training.
- Sgt. Plate reported on the courses covered and the upcoming courses.
- Camp 71 is graduating June 13, 2025 with Camp 72 scheduled to begin in July 2025.

- The NSP Inservice sessions are currently in process.

D. Crime Commission Report (Taken out of order on the agenda.)

Executive Director Bryan Tuma reported the following:

- LB-346 was proposed to eliminate a number of boards and committees that require the governor's appointments. The Racial Profiling committee has not met since May of 2021. Primarily since they could not get a quorum. The Racial Profiling Committee has been reinstated. Steps are being taken to fill the vacancies on the committee. Sheriff Ladwig from Polk County is representing the Sheriff's Association, representatives from PCAN and NE State Patrol are being sought.
- LB-150: Amendment 1370 establishes the mental health expansion pilot project. This was originally proposed in LB-386. It would require the Crime Commission to identify federal funds and coordinate with stakeholders and others to implement mental health services in county jails. This will be a collaboration with the Jail Standards board, DHHS behavioral health people as well as local governments. A proposal has been drawn up to hire someone for the program contingent on finding federal funding to support the program.
- The Lincoln office is being repainted and having new flooring installed so the offices have been move to other spaces in the State Office Building.
- POAN/NSA Conference: The crime commission is planning on having a booth in the vendor area of the fall conference.
- Provided a handout to the Council members giving some perspective on where the Federal Budget is at and what areas are being targeted for cuts and where they are attempting to increase funding.
- There has been no notice of funding opportunities for the current fiscal year primarily because the funds haven't been received. This is all being held up by Congress due to the budget review.

IV. Old Business

A. City of Lincoln v. State of Nebraska et.al (C125-149)

Agency Counsel Sara Bockstadter recommended that the Council go into executive session due to the fact that it is about pending litigation.

MOTION

Sheriff London: I'll make a motion that we go into Executive Session. Everyone can remain that is on the board, Sara, and Liz Gau. Sheriff Osmond seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Sheriff London, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham. Abstained: Asst. Chief Stille. Motion approved.

The Council went into Executive Session at 9:13 a.m.

Chief Reeves called the meeting back to order at 9:21 a.m.

MOTION

Chief Graham: I'll make a motion to come out of Executive Session. Sheriff Osmond seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham, Sheriff London. Abstained: Asst. Chief Stille. Motion approved.

Chief Reeves asked if there was a motion.

MOTION

Sheriff London: I will make a motion that the Nebraska Attorney General's Office enter into a settlement agreement with the City of Lincoln. Chief Graham seconded the motion.

Chief Reeves asked if there was any discussion on the motion.

DISCUSSION

Sheriff Osmond: We just need to add that it's on behalf of, to represent, PSAC.

AMENDED MOTION

Sheriff London: So moved. Chief Graham seconded the amended motion.

Voting in favor: Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham, Sheriff London, Sheriff Osmond. Abstained: Asst. Chief Stille. Motion approved.

B. Reciprocity Proposal/Proposed changes to Title 79, Chapters 3 & 4

Agency Counsel Sara Bockstadter presented a draft of Chapters 3 and 4 to the Council with the changes discussed at the April meeting. Agency Counsel Bockstadter then reviewed the steps necessary for the changing of the rules and regulations. After discussion, the Council recommended the following changes:

- Chapter 3:
 - 002: added 81-1414.13 and 81-1414.13(3)(c) to the reference
 - 004.02: replaced “will” with “must” provide proof that:
 - 004.02A: added 81-1414.13 reference
 - 004.02(B)(1): Replaced the wording with, “An applicant will be deemed to have had the training equivalent to the curriculum in subdivision (2)(a) of section 81-1414 if the applicant is able to provide the Director with a valid certificate or diploma from a state approved academy in the state they are or were most currently employed and verification of a minimum of two consecutive years of full-time employment as a certified law enforcement officer with independent arrest powers.

Time completing a law enforcement academy will not count towards time of employment. For states who will not certify until a probationary period or field training hours are met, those periods may count towards the two years of employment.

 - 004.03A: Changed the wording to; “The applicant will provide information verifying the current classification status of his/her law enforcement certificate/license. The applicant may not have been unemployed or had his/her law enforcement status declared inactive for a period exceeding four (4) years immediately prior to making application.
 - Added 004.03B (previously numbered 004.03A: “The applicant will provide documentation that his/her law enforcement certificate/license is not under investigation, suspension or revoked.
- Chapter 4:
 - 004.01A(3): Removed; “Officers employed and on active status prior to the effective date of this rule shall not be required to submit a Code of Ethics to maintain active status”. (Recommended removal because there is already a rule and regulation that requires everyone to have a Code of Ethics.)

- 004.02B(4)(b): Changed; "In excess of 4 years to 7 years" to "6 years"
- 004.02B(4)©: Changed "7 years" to "6 years"

Sheriff Osmond asked about the requirement to have a letter of good standing and if that caused some issues. Director Stephenson responded that if an applicant could not provide a letter of good standing he would deny the application but would have the agency bring it before the Council for an explanation.

Lt. Col. Roby asked about Federal Officers being able to receive Reciprocity. Director Stephenson responded that it was removed by State Statute and not the rule and regulations. The only Federal officers that could receive Reciprocity are BIA officers trained by FLETC.

MOTION

Sheriff Osmond: I'll make a motion that we submit the changes to Rules and Regulations, Chapters 3 and 4 with the proposed changes that we talked about in this discussion. Sheriff London seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Lt. Col. Roby, Asst. Chief Stille, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham, Sheriff London, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves. Motion approved.

V. New Business

A. Revocation-Voluntary Surrender

1. Keyle Alcorn: LR-284-24

Jon Hendricks entered one exhibit. Exhibit 1 is the Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing for Keyle Alcorn. Chief Reeves accepted the exhibit, and it was entered into the record.

Mr. Hendricks provided the factual summary of the details leading up to the revocation. Mr. Hendricks requested that the Council except the relinquishment and recommended that Mr. Alcorn's Law Enforcement Officer Certificate be revoked under the authority granted in Nebraska Revised Statute 81-1403(6)(c), due to a violation of Mr. Alcorn's oath of office, code of ethics and statutory duties.

MOTION

Sheriff London: Based upon the fact that the respondent has signed a Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing and has voluntarily surrendered his Nebraska Law Enforcement certificate, I make a motion that the Council accept the surrender of Keyle Alcorn's Nebraska Law Enforcement certificate based on the recommendation outlined by Jon Hendricks. Said revocation to be effective upon review and acceptance of the surrender by the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice. Sheriff Osmond seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Asst. Chief Stille, Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham, Sheriff London, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby. Motion approved.

2. Sean Vilmont: LR-219-21

Jon Hendricks entered one exhibit. Exhibit 1 is the Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing for Sean Vilmont. Chief Reeves accepted the exhibit, and it was entered into the record.

Mr. Hendricks provided the factual summary of the details leading up to the revocation. Mr. Hendricks requested that the Council except the relinquishment and recommended that Mr. Vilmont's Law Enforcement Officer Certificate, Management Certificate and Supervision Certificate be revoked based upon the authority granted in Nebraska Revised Statute 81-1403(6)(b) for serious misconduct and also 81-1403(6)(c); due to a violation of Mr. Vilmont's oath of office, code of ethics and statutory duties.

MOTION

Chief Graham: Based upon the fact that the respondent has signed a Consent to Revocation of Law Enforcement Certificate and Waiver of Notice and Hearing and has voluntarily surrendered his certificates, I make a motion that the Council accept the surrender of Sean Vilmont's Nebraska Law Enforcement certificate, his Management certificate and his Supervision certificate based on the recommendation outlined by Jon Hendricks. Said revocation to be effective upon review and acceptance of the surrender by the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice. Sgt. Bolzer seconded the motion.

Voting in favor: Sgt. Bolzer, Chief Graham, Sheriff London, Sheriff Osmond, Chief Reeves, Lt. Col. Roby, Asst. Chief Stille. Motion approved.

B. Management In-Lieu-Of NLETC Course

Director Mark Stephenson reported that Lieutenant Brown of the Bellevue Police Department and Lieutenant Jason Prante of the Nebraska State Patrol completed IACP LPO course. Lieutenant Prante also completed the Northwest University Command of Police and Personnel course. These courses have been evaluated by the Council and found to meet the requirements for State standards. Director Stephenson recommended that the Council approve the request for the waivers to attending the NLETC in-person management course with the provision they complete the online management course.

C. Supervision In-Lieu-Of NLETC Course

All supervision core topics were met, and the courses meet the requirements for State standards. Director Stephenson recommended that the Council approve the request for in-lieu-of training for Sgt. Peyton, Sgt. Sinnett and Sgt. Matyja.

D. Extension of the 1-year Requirement for Management Training

Director Mark Stephenson reported that Lieutenant Knappen has completed the in-person management course and is enrolled in the online portion that begins in

July but will be unable to complete the course before his 1 year date is up.
Director Stephenson recommended the approval of the extension.

12 may proceed. Attorney Sara Bockstadter is here as a legal advisor to the
13 Council. The Council will hear this matter pursuant to Nebraska Revised
14 Statute 81-1403 and Title 79 of the Nebraska Administrative Code,
15 Chapter 9, Revocation of Law Enforcement Officers Certification.

16 **CHAIR:** In this case, the complainant has filed a formal revocation complaint
17 against Ryne Sell, the respondent officer. The allegations for revocation
18 are contained in the complaint filed by the State of Nebraska on March 26,
19 2025. I will note that each Council member has a copy of the formal
20 complaint for their review. No answer has been filed by the respondent
21 officer.

22 **CHAIR:** Special Assistant Attorney General Jonathan Hendricks appears on behalf
23 of the State.

24 **CHAIR:** I will note Ryne Sell is present and there is not counsel present
25 representing him. Mr. Sell, you have the right to be heard, either in person
26 or by counsel, who you have hired at your own expense. Have you
27 retained counsel for this matter?

28 **SELL:** I was supposed to, but they couldn't make it today. So I will just do this
29 myself. I guess my biggest thing is...

30 **CHAIR:** Hang on just a minute will you.

31 **SELL:** Sorry.

32 **CHAIR:** You also have the right, you also have the right, to the Formal Rules of
33 Evidence to govern these proceedings; this request must be made three
34 days before the commencement of the hearing. You also have a right to
35 notice, that is, you also have the right to notice, that is, to receive a
36 statement from the State, the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement
37 and Criminal Justice, detailing or justifying its actions in this matter. In this
38 case, it would be a letter from the Executive Director of the Crime
39 Commission informing you that a revocation complaint was going to be
40 filed against you and that a revocation hearing was going to be convened
41 before the Police Standards Advisory Council.

42 **CHAIR:** Did either you or the attorney receive such a letter from the Executive
43 Director and did the letter provide notice of the hearing and the reasons
44 for having the formal complaint filed against your certification?

45 **SELL:** Yes sir.

46 **CHAIR:** Did you notice any defects in the letter that may have hampered your
47 ability to prepare for the hearing?

48 **SELL:** No sir.

49 **CHAIR:** Additionally, you have a right to have this hearing, where the burden will
50 be on the State of Nebraska to prove by clear and convincing evidence
51 that the allegations contained in the complaint warrant the revocation of
52 your law enforcement certificate based upon the grounds contained in the
53 Nebraska Revised Statute, section 81-1403, subsection 6 and/or Title 79
54 of the Nebraska Administrative Code, Chapter 9. At this hearing, you have
55 a right to present evidence and the right to cross examine any witness that
56 may testify on behalf of the State, a right to a copy of the testimony
57 presented at this hearing. The Police Standards Advisory Council will hear
58 testimony and receive evidence in this matter. The Council, after
59 consideration of this evidence, will make a recommendation on whether
60 said evidence warrants revocation of your Nebraska Law Enforcement
61 Certificate. The Council's findings and recommendation will be reviewed
62 by the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice at
63 its next available meeting. After review by the Crime Commission, you
64 would have the right to appeal through the Nebraska Judicial System if
65 necessary.

66 **CHAIR:** Do you understand these rights?

67 **SELL:** Yes sir.

68 **CHAIR:** The Police Standards Advisory Council shall act as the Hearing Board for
69 this appeal. Neither I, nor any other Council member, will be a witness for
70 either side and I am not aware of any matter, which I believe, may be
71 grounds for challenge by either side against me or the Council members.

72 **CHAIR:** Does any Council member have any personal knowledge of this case?

73 **MEMBERS:** All responded no.

74 **CHAIR:** Does either side have any further questions or challenge for cause against
75 any member of the Council?

76 **CHAIR:** Mr. Hendricks?

77 **HENDRICKS:** I do not sir.

78 **CHAIR:** Mr. Sell?

79 **SELL:** No Mr. Chair.

80 **SARA:** Could you speak up? I don't think that was loud enough for the recording.

81 **SELL:** No.

82 **SARA:** Thank you.

83 **CHAIR:** Mr. Hendricks, the State may proceed with its opening statement at this
84 time.

85 **HENDRICKS:** Thank you. May it please the Council, I'm here this morning to ask, to
86 recommend the revocation of the law enforcement certification of Mr.
87 Ryne A. Sell. I will, essentially, with the State's evidence, will show today,
88 Mr. Sell had a multitude of violations of his law enforcement officer code of
89 ethics during his time at, during his employment as a law enforcement
90 officer at the Omaha Police Department. I will just touch on some of the

91 topics of these violations. I will go into some more explanation during my
92 closing statement. The State's evidence would show that Mr. Sell was
93 involved in a domestic assault incident on April 10th. The State's evidence
94 will show Mr. Sell was involved with using marijuana as well as others
95 using marijuana in his presence while employed as an Omaha police
96 officer. State's evidence will show that Mr. Sell allowed an unauthorized
97 ride-along during his employment as an Omaha police officer and sexual
98 intercourse with that ride-along individual in his patrol cruiser. State's
99 evidence will show Mr. Sell engaged in improper traffic stops to stop
100 romantic interests. State's evidence will show that there was improper use
101 by Mr. Sell of law enforcement databases to look up a romantic interest
102 and members of her family. State's evidence will show Mr. Sell, on a
103 number of occasions, engaged in writing suicidal messages to his
104 romantic interest to get her attention. State's evidence will show that Mr.
105 Sell engaged in outside employment and didn't report that to the Omaha
106 Police Department in violation of policy and State's evidence will show Mr.
107 Sell was dishonest in his internal affairs investigation of these matters and
108 (Unintelligible).

109 **CHAIR:** Mr. Sell, do you have an opening statement that you would like to make?
110 If so, you may proceed.

111 **SELL:** I would like to say, and the dishonesty part of it, it came from that the guy
112 that did my interview with Omaha Police Department, we would find him
113 outside having different conversations with her outside like my, outside the

114 cases and not being interviewed where he would tell me mine would have
115 to be interviewed. So that was where maybe I wasn't completely honest
116 with him, but I was honest with the guy that I spoke to here. And then I'd
117 like to say that for three years now, with a different agency where I've had
118 no policy violations, no issues.

119 **CHAIR:** Mr. Hendricks, you may proceed with your case. Do you have any exhibits
120 or testimony you wish to offer or present at this time?

121 **HENDRICKS:** I do. May I approach?

122 **CHAIR:** Yes.

123 **HENDRICKS:** I'm offering exhibits one through four. Exhibit number 1 is the complaint for
124 revocation of law enforcement officer certification and attached to that are
125 several sub-exhibits which were originally attached to the complaint, so
126 that's exhibit 1A through, I believe, 1H. I'm offering Exhibit 2, which is the
127 notice that Mr. Sell received about today's hearing. I'm offering Exhibit 3,
128 which is the internal affairs investigation and executive case summary
129 regarding the investigation into Mr. Sell and then I'm offering Exhibit 4,
130 which is an investigatory report by Investigator Lindgreen as part of the
131 certification revocation review process.

132 **CHAIR:** Do you want to do these one at a time or?

133 **GOBEL:** You can except them all after you get...

134 **CHAIR:** Mr. Sell do you have any objections to the receipt of the exhibits into
135 evidence?

136 **SELL:** Yes. The vehicle that's posted was at my attorney's office, my sergeant
137 working at the time.

138 **CHAIR:** Which exhibit are you referring to? It should be on the front of...

139 **SELL:** LR-236-22.

140 **CHAIR:** On the front of that, is there an exhibit number on the bottom?

141 **SELL:** Four. That and then the drinking at work...

142 **CHAIR:** Would you back up, I kind of interrupted you. So exhibit 4, what was your
143 first point?

144 **SELL:** On the vehicle posted. I was at my attorney's office. My sergeant actually
145 contacted me that day. And then the marijuana, and then the drinking at
146 work, I sat next to my sergeant every day so I don't know how that would
147 even be possible.

148 **CHAIR:** What was your statement about the marijuana?

149 **SELL:** I would never have taken from (*unintelligible*), and I never had any
150 complaints of evidence not being put in. We wore body cam all the time.
151 And I never objected any alcohol test, I never objected to them looking in
152 my safe so I don't even know how that could be a thing. That would have
153 been done immediately.

154 **CHAIR:** Any objection to any of the other exhibits?

155 **SELL:** The drinking before work, no. And the doing marijuana all the time, that's
156 her best friend and she told me one day that if I didn't listen to what she
157 said, that she would do whatever Allison told her. So then so as soon as
158 we had an argument she specifically said she, I'm going to say, and she's

159 a known marijuana user also. I've take several drug tests since. And
160 everything's came negative when it was brought to my attention, these
161 allegations I went and took a drug test and it came back negative. And
162 ever since then I've taken several with work and stuff.

163 **CHAIR:** Would you grab your packet that has Exhibit 1 on the front page?

164 **SELL:** Yes sir.

165 **CHAIR:** Exhibit 1 is complaint for revocation of law enforcement officer
166 certification. Do you have any objection to Exhibit 1?

167 **SELL:** I would have objection to the smoking marijuana as (*unintelligible*). And
168 then the repeatedly punch the suspect in the face. He was grabbing my
169 duty weapon and I had the duty to get him off of me. And then the
170 domestic violence, no. Because that was investigated by Omaha and
171 there was no charges to that. The only thing that I did is, she went to
172 punch me and I grabbed her hands and told her to stop.

173 **CHAIR:** Ok, this is just a complaint. You can present your evidence when we get
174 through the exhibits.

175 **SELL:** And the use of marijuana use in my presence, it was one time to be
176 honest. It was never in my home. And I had never seized marijuana from a
177 suspect and gave it to her that was, I had never had any complaints of not
178 booking it in, it's all on bodycam and I rode with a partner so they, he
179 would have seen that. The unauthorized stop, it happened but she told me
180 to do it as she wanted to do a video of it to send to her friend. But the
181 consuming alcohol it never happened like I said, I sat next to my sergeant

182 every single night so he would have known and I rode with a partner every
183 night. And the OPD sergeant and lieutenant of the smell of alcohol, the
184 sergeant didn't smell it and he did a test on me and said that I didn't show
185 signs of it and then the lieutenant said something, I asked her if she would
186 like me to give her a PBT and she said no because I didn't show signs.
187 But I have never been suicidal. And then on the improper use of database,
188 she did ask me to look up her dad, she asked me that, I didn't do it just out
189 of interest. And then I did I work for the Dakota County Sheriff's Office, the
190 same place that I work now and for three years now I've had no
191 complaints, no problems. I got a lifesaving award the other day. And then
192 the (*Unintelligible*), it was in the heat of the battle, I thought I did a palm
193 strike but I guess if it was a fist to get his hand off my belt that's what it
194 was. I don't truly know.

195 **CHAIR:** Let's move on to 1A which is a copy of your law enforcement certificate.
196 Any objection to 1A?

197 **SELL:** No sir.

198 **CHAIR:** 1B a signed copy of the Nebraska Law Enforcement Officer Code of
199 Ethics. Any objection to 1B?

200 **SELL:** No sir.

201 **CHAIR:** On Exhibit 1C, personal change in status form, any objections to 1C?

202 **SELL:** No sir.

203 **CHAIR:** Exhibit 1D, is a formal complaint by the Nebraska Commission on Law
204 Enforcement and Criminal Justice. Any objection to 1D?

205 **SELL:** Yes, I object the termination. Sorry, no sir.

206 **CHAIR:** No objections on 1D?

207 **SELL:** That is just saying the termination from Omaha, correct?

208 **CHAIR:** That appears to be accurate.

209 **SELL:** Then no sir.

210 **CHAIR:** And item 1E, letter addressed to you from Dr. Don Arp, informal complaint
211 for revocation dated April 25th 2023.

212 **SELL:** Receiving it? No.

213 **CHAIR:** I'm sorry.

214 **SELL:** I said, receiving it no. I object the revocation part of it.

215 **CHAIR:** Ok, so you have no objections to the exhibit?

216 **SELL:** No sir.

217 **CHAIR:** And Exhibit 1F? It's a response signed by you.

218 **SELL:** No.

219 **CHAIR:** So you have no objections to except on item 1? Ms. Bockstadter, can you
220 offer some advice?

221 **SARA:** Yes chairman, it seems like the objections I hear coming from Mr. Sell are
222 going to contesting the facts contained in those exhibits which he would
223 be able to argue or address in his portion of the hearing today where he
224 has the opportunity to present evidence or testimony with regards to
225 those. I'm not hearing, outside of that, any recognized objection to the
226 boards receipt of that evidence.

227 **CHAIR:** I agree, and I'm going to overrule the objection and receive Exhibits 1
228 through 1G.

229 **CHAIR:** Moving on to Exhibit 2. Mr. Sell do you have any objection to Exhibit 2
230 which is a letter sent to you by the Crime Commission?

231 **SELL:** I don't believe that the stuff was stated in this was necessarily correct.
232 Except that I got the letter.

233 **CHAIR:** I think we are back to the same explanation I'll overrule the objection and
234 Exhibit 2 is accepted. Exhibit 3, there again I noted that you pointed out
235 some things that you don't agree with, and you can speak to those later.
236 But do you have an objection to Exhibit 3?

237 **SELL:** To the allegations yes, but to the Exhibit, no. I guess I don't know how that
238 works, I'm sorry.

239 **CHAIR:** Do you have an objection or not?

240 **SELL:** Yes.

241 **CHAIR:** Ok, with the same explanation on the others, I'm going to overrule the
242 objection and accept Exhibit 3. Do you have Exhibit 4?

243 **SELL:** Yes sir.

244 **CHAIR:** Do you have an objection to Exhibit 4?

245 **SELL:** No sir.

246 **CHAIR:** I'm sorry?

247 **SELL:** I would object to having my license taken away, but I would object to some
248 of the facts in it but again I'm not clear on how it works.

249 **CHAIR:** Same explanation as before, I'm going to overrule the objection and
250 Exhibit 4 is received. So Exhibits 1A through 1G, Exhibits 2, 3, and 4 are
251 received.

252 **CHAIR:** Mr. Hendricks, does the State have any witnesses to testify?

253 **HENDRICKS:** No.

254 **CHAIR:** Does the State have any further evidence?

255 **HENDRICKS:** No.

256 **CHAIR:** Do any members of the Council have question of the State?

257 **GOBEL:** All members responded no.

258 **CHAIR:** Mr. Sell, you may precede with your case. Do you have any Exhibits or
259 testimony you wish to offer? Present it at this time.

260 **SELL:** Everything that was stated in all of this...

261 **SARA:** Just a moment. I need to address Mr. Chairman. If you are going to give a
262 statement, you can testify on your own behalf, we just have to swear you
263 in.

264 **SELL:** Ok.

265 **CHAIR:** Would you raise your right hand please. Do you swear that the testimony
266 you are about to make at this hearing shall be the truth, the whole truth
267 and nothing but the truth?

268 **SELL:** Yes sir.

269 **CHAIR:** You may proceed.

270 **SELL:** A lot of the allegations in this, they came from her wanting her two best
271 friends who always said that they would do anything to get me in trouble in
272 my law enforcement career.

273 **CHAIR:** And when you are referring to "her", who are you referring to?

274 **SELL:** Vanessa, then the other one. I can't think of her name without looking,
275 Victoria and Vanessa. They are the only two that came out and said
276 anything and they are the ones that stated that if something would ever go
277 wrong with me and Aliesha, that they would say whatever they had to do
278 to make sure I got fired. I think that is a very unfair statement in a lot of
279 this because there was no one else that ever witnessed me doing stuff like
280 this or supposedly drinking but her two best friends. And like I said, I rode
281 with a partner every night who is directly by the book and if I would have
282 been drinking, he would have told on me. Because he would have never
283 wanted anything for him to get in trouble. And he would (*unintelligible*). So
284 I think that should be taken into consideration if possible. And like I said, in
285 the last 3 years working for Dakota County Sheriff's Office I've never had
286 any complaints about drinking, any complaints about marijuana, or
287 anything like that so that's not fair. Like I said, I have had several awards
288 working with them.

289 **CHAIR:** Do you have any other exhibits or testimony that you wish to present at
290 this time?

291 **SELL:** No sir.

292 **CHAIR:** Mr. Sell, do you have any witnesses to testify?

293 **SELL:** Not present.

294 **CHAIR:** Mr. Hendricks, do you have any questions for this witness?

295 **HENDRICKS:** Yes Mr. Chairperson. If I may.

296 **CHAIR:** Yes.

297 **HENDRICKS:** You are Ryne A. Sell?

298 **SELL:** Yes sir.

299 **HENDRICKS:** You were certified as a law enforcement officer on March 3rd 2017?

300 **SELL:** Yes.

301 **HENDRICKS:** At or around that time, do you recall signing a law enforcement officer

302 code of ethics?

303 **SELL:** Yes sir.

304 **HENDRICKS:** Were you employed at the Omaha Police Department from approximately

305 September 2016 to July of 2022?

306 **SELL:** Yes sir.

307 **HENDRICKS:** Back on April 10th of 2022, do you recall being a subject of a law

308 enforcement investigation regarding your behavior at the home of an

309 Aliesha Meyer?

310 **SELL:** I was never contacted but I was told later on, yes.

311 **HENDRICKS:** On that day, I guess Ms. Meyer was a romantic interest of yours, correct?

312 **SELL:** We were on and off, yes sir.

313 **HENDRICKS:** On that day did you come to her home without an invitation?

314 **SELL:** No, no sir I did not.

315 **HENDRICKS:** *(unintelligible question)*

316 **SELL:** *(unintelligible answer)*

317 **HENDRICKS:** During your interaction with Ms. Meyer, isn't it true she asked you to leave
318 her apartment several times, to ten times and you refused to do so?

319 **SELL:** She asked me a couple times but as we were in a relationship I found her
320 sending messages, naked pictures to one of her employees so I was
321 trying to question her what our status was and what was going on and why
322 she was doing that and that's why she got upset.

323 **HENDRICKS:** How many times do you think she asked you to leave?

324 **SELL:** 4 or 5 times probably.

325 **HENDRICKS:** Do you recall participating in an interview in 2022 with Mr. Lindgreen here
326 at the Training Center?

327 **SELL:** Yes sir.

328 **HENDRICKS:** Do you recall telling him that it may have been up to 10 times, that you
329 were...

330 **SELL:** Yes, I don't...it's been several years now, I don't remember exactly. This
331 has been over 3 years ago.

332 **HENDRICKS:** During that altercation did you get physical, or during that disturbance or
333 event, did you have physical contact with Ms. Meyer?

334 **SELL:** She went to punch me and I grabbed her hand just like this, to stop her
335 from punching me. And that was it.

336 **HENDRICKS:** You mentioned the use of marijuana while you were, during your term of
337 employment at Omaha Police Department...

338 **SELL:** I ate a little piece of chocolate, yes I did.

339 **HENDRICKS:** Do you admit, during the time of your employment with Omaha Police
340 Department, at the Omaha Police Department, you allowed others to use
341 marijuana in your presence?

342 **SELL:** I did see her do it, yes. It never happened at my house.

343 **HENDRICKS:** But you admit that on one occasion, and this came up during your
344 interview with Mr. Lindgreen, that you purchased cigars, cigar wraps, for
345 the purpose of providing to Ms. Meyer that she could use them to smoke
346 marijuana.

347 **SELL:** I told him that I purchased them, not knowing that necessarily she would
348 use them for that, but yeah.

349 **HENDRICKS:** You were specifically asked that you understood that she would use those
350 to smoke marijuana, is that right?

351 **SELL:** Well in a sense, yeah. Yes sir.

352 **HENDRICKS:** Would you say that conduct would be encouraging the use of marijuana
353 by another person?

354 **SELL:** I would say that I shouldn't have done it. You are correct. I've learned from
355 that. The last three years I've made myself better with that.

356 **HENDRICKS:** Did you, did you admit that during your internal affairs investigation in
357 2022, you denied the use of marijuana while you were actively employed
358 at Omaha Police Department?

359 **SELL:** I did, but only for the fact that he was going outside of interviews with her,
360 and I didn't feel I could trust, that's why I told Lindgreen the truth.

361 **HENDRICKS:** So I just want to back up. You were asked the question at your internal
362 affairs investigation, if you ever used marijuana while employed as an
363 Omaha Police Department officer, correct?

364 **SELL:** Yes.

365 **HENDRICKS:** And you said no, correct?

366 **SELL:** But, that...

367 **HENDRICKS:** I understand there is a reason but I'm asking if you said no.

368 **HENDRICKS:** During your interview with Investigator Lindgreen in 2024 you admitted to
369 occasional use of marijuana while you were employed with the Omaha,
370 Omaha Police Department?

371 **SELL:** The chocolate, I told him yes.

372 **HENDRICKS:** And you admitted to using marijuana while located in Nebraska correct?

373 **SELL:** Yes sir.

374 **HENDRICKS:** You admitted to allowing the use of marijuana in your presence?

375 **SELL:** Yes sir.

376 **HENDRICKS:** I just wanted to clarify, what was your reason, well first off, would you
377 admit that you lied during your internal affairs investigation when asked
378 this question about use of marijuana?

379 **SELL:** To the original investigator, yes. The second one, no, because I knew I
380 could trust him, he wasn't going behind my back.

381 **HENDRICKS:** Did you, in or around February 2022, to allow an unauthorized ride along
382 while you were performing an overtime grant with the Omaha Police
383 Department?

384 **SELL:** Yes sir.

385 **HENDRICKS:** Would you agree that you violated a lot of police department policy by not
386 having the ride along be authorized in advance?

387 **SELL:** Yes sir.

388 **HENDRICKS:** Would you admit that during that ride along, you turned off your body
389 camera during parts of the ride along while even committing a few traffic
390 stops?

391 **SELL:** I guess I didn't realize I turned it off, but I guess if it wasn't on, it wasn't on,
392 I don't.

393 **HENDRICKS:** Do you admit that you had sexual intercourse with your ride along
394 individual while in your patrol cruiser during that unauthorized ride along?

395 **SELL:** Yes sir.

396 **HENDRICKS:** During that, is it true that during your internal affairs investigation in 2022,
397 you denied having sexual intercourse in your patrol cruiser during the
398 unauthorized ride along?

399 **SELL:** Yes sir.

400 **HENDRICKS:** In 2024 during your interview with Investigator Lindgreen, its true that you
401 admitted to having sexual intercourse?

402 **SELL:** Yes.

403 **HENDRICKS:** Would you agree that during that internal affairs investigation in 2022
404 when asked this question about having sexual intercourse in a patrol
405 cruiser, you lied?

406 **SELL:** Yes, but just again, back where he was going out with her, and I didn't feel
407 like I could trust him.

408 **HENDRICKS:** Do you recall conducting an improper traffic stop of a vehicle driven by
409 Aliesha Meyer in 2022?

410 **SELL:** Yes and no. Because she did break the law, so I wrote her a ticket, yes.
411 But I did not, so I...

412 **HENDRICKS:** Let me back up.

413 **SELL:** Ok.

414 **HENDRICKS:** Did you observe any law violations?

415 **SELL:** Ya, when she turned out, yes.

416 **HENDRICKS:** I believe you made a statement, your opening statement that she had
417 asked you to stop her, is that correct?

418 **SELL:** It's both, she did ask me to stop her, but she still broke the law in a sense.

419 **HENDRICKS:** Ok. So you and Ms. Meyer agreed on a plan ahead of time to stop her
420 vehicle?

421 **SELL:** Yes.

422 **HENDRICKS:** During that traffic stop did you issue a citation to Ms. Meyer, not for
423 improper turn but for looking so fucking sexy, is that correct?

424 **SELL:** Yes sir.

425 **HENDRICKS:** Did you also kiss Ms. Meyer during that traffic stop?

426 **SELL:** I could have. It's been so long I don't remember now.

427 **HENDRICKS:** Obviously you were on duty at the time of these events?

428 **SELL:** Yes sir.

429 **HENDRICKS:** Do you admit to improper use of a law enforcement database to look up
430 Aliesha Meyer and other family members?

431 **SELL:** I don't know, I didn't look up her, but I looked up her dad, yes.

432 **HENDRICKS:** And you would admit that you were not doing that for a law enforcement
433 purpose, you were doing that on request of Ms. Meyer?

434 **SELL:** Yes.

435 **HENDRICKS:** Then would you admit that you shared information with Ms. Meyer about
436 what you had found on the database?

437 **SELL:** Yes sir.

438 **HENDRICKS:** Would you admit that throughout your relationship with Mr. Meyer, at times
439 you sent her messages indicating that you were suicidal?

440 **SELL:** Probably to get her attention, yes.

441 **HENDRICKS:** During your employment with the Omaha Police Department, did you also
442 hold employment at Allied Security and Dakota County Sheriff's
443 Department?

444 **SELL:** Yes sir.

445 **HENDRICKS:** Is it true that you did not report that employment to Omaha Police
446 Department?

447 **SELL:** The Allied, yes. I didn't report that. The Dakota County Sheriffs no.

448 **HENDRICKS:** Did you admit that you were terminated from your employment at Allied
449 Security?

450 **SELL:** Yes.

451 **HENDRICKS:** During your internal affairs investigation isn't it true that you were asked
452 that question and you denied you were terminated?

453 **SELL:** No. I told them that I was.

454 **HENDRICKS:** And isn't it true that the reason for your termination was dishonesty on
455 your timecards?

456 **SELL:** It's because I never had time to fix it. It was the next morning when they
457 called me.

458 **HENDRICKS:** Essentially you clocked in time you hadn't been actually working?

459 **SELL:** We were to write in our times in when we show up, like the time we start
460 and the time we end all at once. And I had left early and I had not had time
461 to fix it.

462 **HENDRICKS:** Would you agree during your interview in 2024 you admitted that occurred
463 on more than one occasion?

464 **SELL:** It happened twice, yes.

465 **HENDRICKS:** I have no further questions.

466 **CHAIR:** Mr. Sell, do you have any other evidence you want to offer?

467 **SELL:** No sir.

468 **CHAIR:** Do you have any statements you would like to make?

469 **SELL:** I would just like to say that I understand some of these events have
470 happened. I've made mistakes. I've learned from them. I've made myself a
471 way better officer. I would like to definitely continue as an officer. I've
472 taken a lot of steps to, like I said, to be a better officer and learn from
473 these mistakes. I don't want to lose this. I've worked hard for it. Even

474 when I screwed up, but I would like to be able to continue my chance at
475 this to prove that I can be a good officer.

476 **CHAIR:** Mr. Hendricks, does the State wish to make a closing statement?

477 **HENDRICKS:** Yes thank you. Your honor, again I'm requesting or recommending that
478 you revoke Mr. Sell's law enforcement certificate. Mr. Sell received his
479 certification in 2017. He has worked at a few different law enforcement
480 agencies during his career. On April 10th of 2022 law enforcement was
481 detailed to a residence in Omaha Nebraska to investigate a domestic
482 complaint. Information about this is set forth in Exhibit 3 and Exhibit 4
483 that's been received today. This was the home of Aliesha Meyer who
484 claimed that Mr. Sell had arrived at her home without an invitation that
485 night. She allowed him into the home. After some sexual contact occurred,
486 Ms. Meyer asked for it to stop and that led to an argument. According to
487 her, at one point Mr. Sell held her down by her wrists which caused her
488 pain. Ms. Meyer then went into the bathroom where she stated that she
489 asked Mr. Sell to leave several times and he refused. She eventually
490 called his mother to convince him to leave and a friend who called 911.
491 Mr. Sell fled before law enforcement arrived. And ultimately while there
492 were not charges in relation to that incident it was referred for charges the
493 County Attorney opted not to prosecute. Later in April of 2022 Ms. Meyer
494 made a citizen's complaint concerning other behavior of Mr. Sell during his
495 employment at Omaha Police Department. An internal affairs investigation
496 launched and took place in April and May of 2022 and that report is Exhibit

497 3. The conclusion of that is Mr. Sell was terminated from his position from
498 the Omaha Police Department in July of 2022. As I mentioned in my
499 questioning, Mr. Sell was interviewed by Investigator Daron Lindgreen
500 here at the Training Center as part of the revocation proceedings. And to
501 kind of summarize the findings of those two investigations, regarding this
502 April 10th domestic incident in Omaha, Mr. Sell admitted to refusing to
503 leave the apartment after being asked to leave for at least 10 times. Mr.
504 Sell admitted to grabbing Ms. Meyer by the arms. He did so because he
505 thought she was going to hit him. In regards to marijuana use, several
506 witnesses, I believe three, did come forward and were interviewed in both
507 reports when it came to Mr. Sell had used marijuana while employed by
508 the Omaha Police Department. One witness, I recall saying it was at least
509 a dozen times. He also allowed the use of marijuana by these individuals
510 in his presence. Two witnesses described a time when Mr. Sell had seized
511 marijuana during his employment as an officer and had provided that
512 marijuana to them. As set forth today, during the internal affairs
513 investigation in 2022, Mr. Sell denied the use of marijuana all together
514 while employed as an officer of OPD. But during Investigator Lindgreen's
515 investigation Mr. Sell did admit to use of marijuana while employed as an
516 Omaha Police Department officer. He admitted to allowing the use of
517 marijuana in his presence by others. He admitted to buying cigar wraps on
518 one occasion knowing that he would provide that to Ms. Meyer for the
519 purpose of he smoking marijuana. Mr. Sell denied that he ever provided

520 marijuana seized during a traffic stop to others but he did admit to
521 occasions where he would destroy marijuana that he seized instead of
522 placing it into evidence. In regards to another complaint received was that
523 respondent had allowed an unauthorized ride along in 2022 while on duty.
524 Mr. Sell has admitted to that today. I would point out that during the
525 internal affairs investigation, he denied that he had sexual intercourse with
526 his ride along participant. However, admitted to that today and also with
527 his interview in 2024. In addition, portions of that ride along the body
528 camera was turned off despite there being traffic stops conducted which
529 was a violation of Omaha Police Department policy. Mr. Sell, another
530 complaint against Mr. Sell was that he conducted this improper traffic stop
531 on Ms. Meyer's vehicle without a legal reason to do so. He had written a
532 citation for being so "f-ing" sexy. He kissed her during the traffic stop.
533 Respondent had admitted this conduct in both interviews and again today.
534 Another complaint directed that respondent was, that he had accessed
535 law enforcement databases to look up Ms. Meyer and other members of
536 her family and then shared information with her. Respondent has admitted
537 to that behavior during the interviews and also today. Another complaint
538 alleged against the respondent was that when Ms. Meyer would attempt to
539 break up with him, the respondent would respond with suicidal messages
540 indicating he was going to kill himself. Some of these messages were
541 shared in those reports. The respondent has admitted to writing the
542 message to get attention. A final complaint that I'll address was that set

543 forth in Exhibit 3 and 4 is that during Mr. Sell's employment with OPD he
544 also held other jobs which apparently were not reported, in violation of
545 OPD policy. But going further, Mr. Sell had a job with Allied Security and
546 was terminated. He denied in his internal affairs investigation that he was
547 terminated. During Investigator Lindgreen's interview in 2024 Mr. Sell now
548 admitted that he was terminated from Allied Security for falsifying time
549 sheets on at least two occasions. So overall I would ask the Council,
550 recommend to the Council to revoke Mr. Sell's law enforcement
551 certification based on the authority found in Nebraska Revised Statute 81-
552 1403(6)(c), violation of the officer's oath of office, code of ethics and
553 statutory duties. And looking at that code of ethics, if you read through
554 that, it appears that Mr. Sell violated almost every code of ethic to some
555 degree. One code of ethic says to obey law, the criminal laws of the city,
556 county, state and federal government, well, Mr. Sell's admitted to using
557 marijuana during the time of his employment at OPD, that occurring in
558 Nebraska where it's illegal. Another part of the code of ethics is that Mr.
559 Sell promised to conduct himself at all times in a manner that does not
560 damage or have the likelihood to damage the public reputation of the
561 agency. I would point out the improper traffic stop on a romantic interest,
562 having intercourse in a cruiser during a ride along, making suicidal threats
563 to a love interest to get her attention, all those kind of things would breach
564 that code of ethics because that, if discovered, would likely bring damage
565 to the agency at which he worked. Mr. Sell as part of those code of ethics

566 he agreed to not to lie and his actions with another person or organization
567 it is reasonable to expect such information may be relied upon. Mr. Sell
568 has admitted today and admitted in his 2024 interview, he lied during his
569 internal affairs investigation in 2022 regarding his marijuana use,
570 regarding having sex, sexual intercourse during his unauthorized ride
571 along, he lied, I believe the evidence shows between Exhibits 3 and 4 that
572 he lied about his termination from Allied Security for his dishonest
573 timecards. Lastly, yet another code of ethics, I believe was violated by Mr.
574 Sell with the promise he would willfully observe and obey written rules,
575 duties and procedures of his agency. So on that topic we have an
576 unauthorized ride along which was in violation of OPD policy, turning off
577 his body camera during that ride along while conducting some traffic stops
578 which was also in violation of OPD policy, destroying marijuana instead of
579 putting it into evidence, not reporting outside employment and those
580 matters speak to that tenet of the code of ethics. So, I think overall the
581 Council has multiple grounds on which to terminate or to revoke Mr. Sell's
582 law enforcement certificate based on the violation of a multitude of his
583 code of ethics. Thank you.

584 **CHAIR:** Thank you. Mr. Sell do you wish to make a closing statement?

585 **SELL:** I would like to say every law enforcement agency has destroying
586 evidence, if it's a small amount and I've always done it on camera or with
587 a partner, so that, I think, should be thrown out. Yes, I did make mistakes,
588 but this stuff also happened three years ago. I have changed myself as a

589 law enforcement officer and I've done everything to make myself a better
590 officer. I understand I did make some mistakes then and I own those
591 mistakes, but I don't think it's grounds for me to lose my license now. I got,
592 like I said, I've went three years now, I've done several big cases, I've
593 gotten, done several good arrests, I've gotten a lifesaving award now
594 again, I think that I can prove to myself and to you guys that I deserve to
595 still be a law enforcement officer. My only mistakes I did, I screwed up, I
596 made some mistakes but I don't think it's grounds for me to lose it. Now if I
597 get another complaint or something, absolutely. And I also agree that
598 every agency that I go to, I'll have to share all of this information with
599 them. But I think I deserve to still hold my license and continue to work.

600 **CHAIR:** Thank you. The chair would entertain a motion to go into Executive
601 Session.

602 **LONDON:** I move that Council go into Executive Session based on the prevention of
603 needless injury to the reputation to Ryne Sell. And for the purposes of
604 Executive Session we will allow the following to remain in the room; all
605 Council members, Legal Advisor Sara Bockstadter and Liz Gau.

606 **GOBEL:** And Jon?

607 **LONDON:** And Jon, no?

608 **SARAH:** No attorney's, just me.

609 **LONDON:** All right, then let me rephrase that. For the purposes of Executive Session
610 we'll allow the following to remain in the room; legal advisor Sara
611 Bockstadter and Steve?

612 **GOBEL:** No.

613 **LONDON:** No Steve, ok. That's my motion.

614 **GRAHAM:** Second.

615 **CHAIR:** Any discussion? Let's vote.

616 **GOBEL:** Chief Reeves?

617 **REEVES:** Yes.

618 **GOBEL:** Lt. Col. Roby?

619 **ROBY:** Yes.

620 **GOBEL:** Asst. Chief Stille?

621 **STILLE:** Yes.

634 **CHAIR:** Any discussion? Hearing none, let's vote on coming out of Executive
635 Session.

636 **GOBEL:** Lt. Col Roby?

637 **ROBY:** Yes.

638 **GOBEL:** Asst. Chief Stille?

639 **STILLE:** Yes.

640 **GOBEL:** Sgt. Bolzer?

641 **BOLZER:** Yes.

642 **GOBEL:** Chief Graham?

643 **GRAHAM:** Yes.

644 **GOBEL:** Sheriff London?

646 **GOBEL:** Sheriff Osmond?

647 **OSMOND:** Yes.

648 **GOBEL:** Chief Reeves?

649 **REEVES:** Yes.

650 **GOBEL:** We are out of Executive Session at 11:33 a.m.

651 **CHAIR:** Is there a motion from the Council on this matter?

652 **LONDON:** Based on clear and convincing evidence presented at the hearing today in
653 case number LR-236-22 and the facts that the respondent was duly
654 notified, I hereby move that the Council revoke Ryne Sell's Nebraska Law
655 Enforcement Officer certification. Said revocation effective upon the

656 review and approval of the Nebraska Crime, the Nebraska Commission on
657 Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice.

658 **BOLZER:** I'll second.

659 **CHAIR:** Any discussion? Hearing none, let's vote.

660 **GOBEL:** Asst. Chief Stille?

661 **STILLE:** Yes.

662 **GOBEL:** Sgt. Bolzer?

663 **BOLZER:** Yes.

664 **GOBEL:** Chief Graham?

665 **GRAHAM:** Yes.

666 **GOBEL:** Sheriff London?

667 **LONDON:** Yes.

674 **GOBEL:** Motion approved.

675 **CHAIR:** The motion to revoke the respondent's law enforcement officer certificate
676 has been sustained and now will be forwarded along with the findings of
677 facts and conclusions to the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement
678 and Criminal Justice for final action at a subsequent public hearing. The

679 date is contingent upon the preparation of the findings and their review
680 and approval by this body. I would anticipate the Crime Commission will
681 review this at its August 15, 2025, meeting in Lincoln. Notice of the Crime
682 Commission hearing will be provided to the parties. If there is nothing
683 further, then I will adjourn this hearing, and we will turn our attention to the
684 rest of the agenda. The time is now 11:35 a.m.

1 **J.** **Revocation Hearing**

2 2. Mark Flash (LR-246-23)

3 **CHAIR:** Item J2 is a revocation hearing for Mark Flash.

4 **HENDRICKS:** Thank you. I'm hear for the revocation of law enforcement certification for

5 Mark B. Flash.

6 **SARA:** Just a moment. Before Mr. Hendricks goes on we probably should go, for

7 the record, what time it is we're starting this hearing, whose here, and note

8 the non-appearance of the respondent.

9 **CHAIR:** This revocation hearing before the Police Standards Advisory Council in

10 the matter of State of Nebraska v. Mark Flash, Case number LR-246-23 is

11 called to order. The date is May 21, 2025 and the time is 11:36 a.m. The

12 following Council members are present; Chief Paul Graham, Sgt. Drew

13 Bolzer, Asst. Chief Jason Stille, Lt. Col. Jeff Roby, Sheriff Dan Osmond,

14 Sheriff Greg London, and Chief Steve Reeves. The following Council

15 members are not present; Matthew McCarthy and Deputy Chief Sherie

16 Thomas.

17 **CHAIR:** I will note that there is a quorum of the Council present, so this hearing

18 may proceed. Attorney Sara Bockstadter is here as a legal advisor to the

19 Council. The Council will hear this matter pursuant to Nebraska Revised

20 Statute 81-1403 and Title 79 of the Nebraska Administrative Code,

21 Chapter 9, Revocation of Law Enforcement Officers Certification. In this

22 case, the complainant has filed a formal revocation complaint against

23 Mark Flash, the respondent officer. The allegations for revocation are

24 contained in the complaint filed by the State of Nebraska, on March 26,
25 2025. I will note that each Council member has a copy of the formal
26 complaint for their review. No answer has been filed by the respondent
27 officer.

28 **CHAIR:** Special Assistant Attorney Jonathan Hendrics will appear on behalf of the
29 State.

30 **CHAIR:** I will note that Mark Flash is not present and there is not counsel
31 representing him.

32 **CHAIR:** The Police Standards Advisory Council shall act as the Hearing Board for
33 this appeal. Neither I, nor any other Council member, will be a witness for
34 either side and I am not aware of any matter, which I believe, may be
35 grounds for challenge by either side against me or the Council members.
36 Does any Council member have any personal knowledge of this case?

37 **MEMBERS:** All members answered no.

38 **CHAIR:** Does either side have any further questions or challenge for cause against
39 any member of the Council? Mr. Hendricks?

40 **SARA:** Do you have any cause for challenge?

41 **HENDRICKS:** No.

42 **CHAIR:** Mr. Hendricks, the State may proceed with it's opening statement.

43 **HENDRICKS:** I'll waive an opening statement.

44 **CHAIR:** Mr. Hendricks you may proceed with your case. Do you have any Exhibits
45 to present at this time?

46 **HENDRICKS:** I do have exhibits. May I approach?

47 **CHAIR:** Yes.

48 **HENDRICKS:** I'm offering Exhibit 1, this is the complaint for revocation of Mr. Flash's law
49 enforcement officer certifications. Attached to that are sub-exhibits that
50 were attached to the original complaint, 1A through 1H. I'm offering Exhibit
51 2, which is the notice dated March 21 of 2025, notifying Mr. Flash of
52 today's hearing. I'd offer Exhibit number 3, which is a return of service
53 showing that Mr. Flash was served with the notice of today's hearing on
54 April 1st 2025 by personal service. The last thing I would offer is Exhibit
55 number 4, which is the Nebraska City Police Department report of the
56 events leading up to the arrest of Mr. Flash occurring on August 21, 2022.

57 **CHAIR:** Exhibits 1A through 1H, 2, 3 and 4 are received. Mr. Hendricks, does the
58 State have any witnesses to testify?

59 **HENDRICKS:** No sir.

60 **CHAIR:** Do any Council have any questions of the State?

61 **NO QUESTIONS WERE ASKED**

62 **CHAIR:** Does the State have any further evidence?

63 **HENDRICKS:** No further evidence.

64 **CHAIR:** Does the State wish to make a closing statement?

65 **HENDRICKS:** Yes. I am here this morning to recommend the revocation of law
66 enforcement certifications of Mark B. Flash. I will note at the outset that
67 there is a default procedure in the regulations of Nebraska Administrative
68 Code, Title 79, Chapter 9, 12.06 that if a respondent fails to appear at a
69 formal hearing is deemed to be in admission of the facts alleged in the

70 complaint and the Council may render its decision upon the evidence
71 submitted by the petitioner. Obviously Mr. Flash was served with a notice
72 of today's hearing over a month ago. To summarize the basis of the
73 recommendation for revocation, Mr. Flash received his law enforcement
74 officer certification in 2002 and his supervisor certification in 2014. He
75 worked in several law enforcement agencies during his career. Where his
76 most recent employment as a law enforcement officer, Mr. Flash was
77 employed at the Otoe County Sheriff's Office but was terminated for an
78 internal discipline reasons in 2020 prior to the events to the events leading
79 to this action for revocation. The State's evidence, laid out within the
80 State's evidence provided today by Exhibit. On September 15, 2022 was
81 charged in Otoe County court with the offense of domestic assault 3rd
82 degree and obstruction of a law enforcement officer. Occurring on August
83 21st 2022, according to the police reports, which have been provided as
84 Exhibit 4, law enforcement responded to Mr. Flash's residence after
85 receiving a report that Mr. Flash had assaulted his wife from of Mr. Flash's
86 children. Ms. Flash was contacted at her home, observed to have been
87 crying and stated that her husband Mark Flash had drank to much and
88 had beat her up. It was further explained by Ms. Flash that she and Mark
89 Flash had attended a party and were driving home to Nebraska City. Mr.
90 Flash was in the backseat of her vehicle when he became upset began to
91 assault Ms. Flash, including pulling her hair and pulling her shirt against
92 her neck and hitting her multiple times in the head and shoulder. Officers

93 observed strands of hair that had been pulled from Mrs. Flash's head,
94 leaving bald spots on the top of her head. They also observed and
95 photographed swelling and redness to Mrs. Flash's shoulder. Mark Flash
96 was located at the scene. He was intoxicated and in the opinion of the
97 officers he was arrested. According to the officers Mr. Flash resisted being
98 placed in handcuffs and refused to follow commands to stand and walk.
99 Mr. Flash had to be physically carried to a patrol vehicle. During the
100 search of the vehicle involved in the incident officers found Mrs. Flash's
101 hair in another seat and in the rear seat. An informal complaint was
102 received on March 2nd of 2023. Mr. Flash was notified of the informal
103 complaint by a letter from the Executive Director dated on March 6th 2023.
104 On May 17th of 2023, Mr. Flash entered a plea deal of no contest and was
105 convicted of assault 3rd degree, a Class 1 misdemeanor for the events
106 occurring on August 21st 2022. On September 14th of 2024 Mr. Flash was
107 notified by certified mail, the Executive Director's decision to request
108 formal revocation of his law enforcement certificates. Mr. Flash was
109 served with notice of today's hearing which is Exhibit 2 on April 1st 2025
110 and the proof of service is provided to the Council in Exhibit 3. I would
111 recommend that the Council revoke Mr. Flash's law enforcement officer
112 certification and his supervisor certification on the authority found in
113 Nebraska Revised Statute 81-1403(6)(a)(iii), which is a misdemeanor
114 violation of state or federal law, if the violation has a rational connection to
115 the officer's fitness or capacity to serve as a law enforcement officer.

116 Additionally, under Nebraska Revised Statute 81-1403(6)(c) which is a
117 violation of Mr. Flash's Nebraska Law Enforcement Officer code of ethics,
118 which includes obeying criminal laws of the city, county, state and federal
119 government.

120 **CHAIR:** Do I have a motion to go into Executive Session?

121 **LONDON:** I would move that the Council go into Executive Session based on the
122 prevention of needless injury to the reputation of Mark Flash and for the
123 purpose of Executive Session we will allow the following to remain in the

171 Enforcement and Criminal Justice. It's not only his certification but his
172 supervision certifications also.

191 has been sustained and now will be forwarded along with the findings of
192 fact and conclusions to the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement
193 and Criminal Justice for final action at a subsequent public hearing. The
194 date is contingent upon the preparation of the findings and their review
195 and approval by this body. I would anticipate the Crime Commission will
196 review this at its August 15, 2025 meeting in Lincoln. Notice of the Crime
197 Commission hearing will be provided to the parties.

198 **CHAIR:** If there is nothing further, then I will adjourn this hearing, and we will turn
199 our attention to the remaining items on the agenda. The time is 11:54 a.m.
