I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Osmond called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M. Roll call: Sheriff Dan Osmond, Chief Deputy Greg London, Chief Mark Hogue, Sergeant Drew Bolzer, Lieutenant Colonel Buck Duis, Assistant Chief Brian Jackson, Deputy Chief Sherie Thomas, Mr. Matthew McCarthy, and Chief Tracy Wolf were not present.

A current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was on hand and available for reference. Notice of the meeting was published in the Lincoln Journal Star on Friday, November 4th.

II. APPROVAL OF OCTOBER 19, 2022, P.S.A.C. MINUTES

MOTION

Chief Wolf motioned to approve the October 19th minutes. Sergeant Bolzer seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Sheriff Osmond, Sergeant Bolzer, Chief Hogue, Chief Deputy London, Deputy Chief Thomas, Chief Wolf. Assistant Chief Jackson did not hear the motion and did not vote. Mr. McCarthy and Lieutenant Colonel Duis were absent. The motion passed unanimously.

MOTION

A motion was made by Assistant Chief Jackson and seconded by Chief Hogue to go into Executive Session based on the prevention for needless injury to the reputation of Taylor Menke and for the purposes of Executive Session we allow the following to stay in the room; the Council secretary and legal advisor, Mr. Stolz. Voting in favor: Osmond, Bolzer, Duis, Hogue, Jackson, and London. Motion carried.

Stolz reminded those present in Executive Session that they must restrict their discussion in closed session to the issue currently before the Council.

A motion was made by Chief Deputy London and seconded by Sheriff Osmond based on the evidence presented today, I'm going to make a motion that we revoke the law enforcement officer certification for Taylor Menke on conviction of his Class I misdemeanor which bears a rational connection to his code of ethics and his violation of statutory duties. Voting in favor; Osmond, Bolzer, Duis, Hogue, Jackson, and London. Motion carried.

**H. Title 79, Chapter 8
Training Academy Admission Qualifications and Procedures
PRO Review**

Mr. Stolz addressed the Council stating:

1. PRO reviewed and made grammatical changes to Chapter 8
2. Made a substance change under the good character section dealing with 005.02A6 Does not have a history of substance use to include 6b Has not used marijuana (the Council put) has not used marijuana for any purpose in the last 12 months unless the use becomes lawful in the state of Nebraska. PRO struck the last intentional language (~~unless the use becomes lawful in the state of Nebraska.~~). I made inquiry to Dustin, our rep, as to why, if he could give me an answer. He talked to the acting PRO, who is also the Chief of Staff for the Governor and basically their take on it is they don't like rules with a contingency built into them.

I will push harder on this if you would like and wait it out. I just don't know how successful it will be. What would the Council like?
