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NEBRASKA COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE

May 4, 2012

The Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice met Friday, May 4, 2012 at 9:30 AM in Lower Level Conference Room A of the Nebraska State Office Building, 301 Centennial Mall South, Lincoln, Nebraska. Legal notice of the meeting was published April 20, 2012 in the Lincoln Journal Star.

As amended by LB 898, 2005 Legislature, a copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for public review.

I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 9:32 AM by Acting Chairman John Freudenberg. The following members were **in attendance**: Acting Chair John Freudenberg, David Baker (arrived 9:40), Candice Batton, Jeff Davis, Joe Kelly (left at 9:40), Robert Houston, Robert Lausten, Don Overman, Fred Ruiz, David Sankey, Rita Sanders, Brenda Smith (arrived 9:40), Mike Swain, Derek Vaughn and William White. **Staff present**: Michael Behm, William Muldoon, Michael Overton, Lisa Stamm, Merry Wills, Cindy Gans, Linda Krutz, Bruce Ayers, Jeff Beaty, David Stolz, and Ann Bauers.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion

A motion was made by Sankey and seconded by Overman to approve the minutes of the Police Standards Advisory Council meetings of December 21, 2011, January 18, 2012, February 15, 2012 and March 21, 2012; Jail Standards Board meeting of January 20, 2012; Crime Commission meeting of January 27, 2012; Crime Victims Reparations meeting of January 27, 2012; Office of Violence Prevention meeting of February 23, 2012; Racial Profiling Advisory Committee meeting of March 22, 2012; and the Nebraska Coalition for Juvenile Justice meeting of March 23, 2012. The motion passed unanimously by acclamation.

III. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

V. NEW BUSINESS

A. Dismissal of Complaint LR-044-06 against Michael Vance

Behm gave a brief summary of the complaint against Michael Vance and the reasons for his recommendation to dismiss the complaint.

Motion

A motion was made by Vaughn and seconded by Sankey to dismiss the complaint against Michael Vance LR-044-06. Voting in favor of the motion: Batton, Davis, Kelly, Houston, Lausten, Overman, Ruiz, Sankey, Sanders, Swain, Vaughn and White. Motion carried unanimously.

B. Dismissal of Complaint LR-026-02 against Brian Smith

Behm gave a brief summary of the complaint against Brian Smith and the reasons for his recommendation to dismiss the complaint. There was a brief discussion about the reasons to set aside a conviction when considering complaints against a law enforcement officer and also on why this complaint took so long to resolve.

Motion

A motion was made by Vaughn and seconded by Houston to dismiss the complaint against Brian Smith LR-026-02. Voting in favor of the motion: Batton, Davis, Houston, Kelly, Lausten, Overman, Ruiz, Sankey, Sanders, Swain, Vaughn and White. Abstain: Smith. Motion carried.

Behm gave a brief summary of the complaint against Adam Miller and the reasons for his recommendation to dismiss the complaint.

Voting in favor of the motion: Batton, Davis, Houston, Lausten, Overman, Ruiz, Sanders, Smith, Swain, Vaughn and White. Abstaining from the Motion: Sankey. Motion Carried

3. Delaying Action on Operation Instruction #50-12, and Changes to OI#50-30, OI#50-41

H. Approval of Changes to Operating Instruction #8

Behm stated that a committee has been formed to go over all of the Operating Instructions and bring them up to date. Behm then gave a brief summary on the proposed changes to Operating Instruction #8 which pertains to the operation of the Video Library.

Motion

A motion was made by White and seconded by Lausten to approve the changes to Operating Instruction #8. Voting in favor of the motion: Batton, Davis, Houston, Lausten, Overman, Ruiz, Sankey, Sanders, Smith, Swain, Vaughn and White. Motion carried unanimously.

I. Approval of Rescinding Operating Instruction #13

Behm stated that Operating Instructions #13 County Attorney's Application Procedure be rescinded because of LB994 which passed on 2000 and changed the language in Neb. Rev. Stat §81-1982. He further stated that county attorneys are no longer eligible for Law Enforcement Improvement Funds (LEIF funds).

Motion

A motion was made by Vaughn and seconded by Sankey to rescind Operating Instruction #13 as presented by Behm. Voting in favor of the motion: Batton, Davis, Houston, Lausten, Overman, Ruiz, Sanders, Sankey, Smith, Swain, Vaughn and White. Motion carried unanimously.

J. Approval of Rescinding Operating Instruction #16

Behm stated that Operating Instruction #16 is for Legislative Procedures and is no longer used as it was found to be unworkable because the time constraints of the legislative process. Bruce Ayers gave a brief summary of the makeup of the committee and that it has not been active in quite a while.

Motion

A motion was made by Overman and seconded by Smith to rescind Operating Instruction #16 as presented by Behm. Voting in favor of the motion: Batton, Davis, Houston, Lausten, Overman, Ruiz, Sanders, Sankey, Smith, Swain, Vaughn and White. Motion carried unanimously.

K. Approval of Rescinding Operating Instruction #29

Behm stated that Operating Instruction #29 is for the Criminal Justice Clearinghouse Library which is no longer used. Behm requested that it needs to be rescinded.

Motion

A motion was made by Sankey and seconded by Lausten to rescind Operating Instruction #29 as presented by Behm. Voting in favor of the motion: Batton, Davis, Houston, Lausten, Overman, Ruiz, Sanders, Sankey, Smith, Swain, Vaughn and White. Motion carried unanimously.

L. Report on compliance with 2011 Continuing Legal Education Requirements by County and Deputy County Attorneys

Behm gave a summary on the procedure for reporting the Continuing Legal Education hours to the County Attorneys Standards Advisory Council. Behm stated that the council received requests for 11 waivers, and there was one county attorney who failed to comply with submitting a CLE form and who did not request a hearing with the Commission. He further stated that all others have met their annual requirement for training in 2011. If the waivers are granted the hours will be added to the 2012 hour requirements.

Behm stated that the County Attorney's Standards Advisory Council has recommended that waivers be granted to 10 of the county/deputy county attorneys, that the waiver be denied to George Vinton, Hooker County Attorney and be reported to the Attorney General's Office for further action, and that the Commission report the non-compliance of Arlan Wine, Chase County Attorney to the Attorney General for further action all in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat §23-1212 to 1222.

Vaughn asked if the committee had made a determination of the failure to file was willful and negligent. Behm stated that the correspondence was silent on the issue concerning Arlan Wine. Vaughn then asked about George Vinton and Bauers answered that the

committee felt that he has request waivers for several years and the tone of his letter was he should have to do it, so they didn't want to continue to just rubber stamp the request.

Smith asked if the attorneys are required to give a reason for not obtaining the necessary hours or if there was documentation. Behm stated that the majority have stated they didn't get the hours accomplished because of a case load or something kept them from attending training. Smith asked if they are required to provide proof. Vaughn stated that the reason is usually included in the letter requesting the waiver. Behm stated that as far as the Crime Commission is concerned, every effort is made to contact all attorneys and to work with them to get the documentation submitted.

Bauers stated that the council set July 1, 2012 as the deadline for the 2011 hours to be completed or they would be found in non-compliance. She further stated that the council has decided to develop a form that would have to be submitted with future waiver requests that would specify why the request was being made and also a timeline or plan to achieve the makeup hours. Batton asked if the commission had a policy of granting hours one year and then being tough on the requestor the second year. Behm stated that in the past they have been very lenient in granting waiver requests. Lausten asked how many attorneys did comply with the requirement. Bauers answered that all did, except the few requesting waivers. She further stated that the problem was the same names are on the waiver list year after year.

Overman stated that in the private sector, if you don't get the required hours, you are out of luck. Vaughn commented that this will require the Attorney General to file civil action against the attorneys who do not comply and wanted to know if this had ever been done in the past. There was a brief discussion on the ramifications of what would happen to these elected officials. Ruiz stated that this same conversation happened years ago when he came to the board and it's time to show a leadership position and send a message.

Motion

A motion was made by Smith and seconded by Houston to accept the County Attorneys Standards Advisory Council's recommendation to grant waivers of the 2011 Continuing Legal Education requirements to: Renee Mathias, Deputy Douglas County Attorney; K.J. Hutchinson, Box Butte County Attorney; Ashley Boettcher, Boyd County Attorney; Eric Scott, Cherry County Attorney; Jennifer Dugan-Hinrichs, Deputy Douglas County Attorney; Phillip Kleine, Deputy Sarpy County Attorney; Brandi Lang, Deputy Sarpy County Attorney; Michael Smith, Deputy Sarpy County Attorney; Douglas Palik, Deuel County Attorney; and George Hirschbach, Cedar County Attorney; to deny the waiver to George Vinton, Hooker County Attorney and report his non-compliance to the Attorney General for further action; and report the non-compliance of Arlan Wine to the Attorney General for further action in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat §23-1212 to 1222. Voting in favor of the motion: Batton, Davis, Houston, Lausten, Overman, Sanders, Sankey, Smith, and Swain. Voting against: Ruiz. Abstaining from the motion: Vaughn and White. Motion carried.

M. Approval for Dawson County 11-VP-5003 in the amount of \$66,484

Stamm reviewed the current level of available funds and the funding recommendations of the Grant for Dawson County 11-VP-5003 in the amount of \$66,484 to provide gang prevention and intervention enhancement in Dawson County.

Motion

A motion was made by Vaughn and seconded by Sankey to approve the funding of the grant for Dawson County 11-VP-5003 in the amount of \$66,484. Voting in favor of the motion: Batton, Davis, Houston, Lausten, Overman, Ruiz, Sanders, Sankey, Smith, Swain, Vaughn and White. Motion carried unanimously.

N. JAG Strategic Plan Update

Dr. Spohn gave an update and brief summary on the JAG Strategic Plan. There were no questions or discussion by the board.

O. DMC Update

Dr. Ann Hobbs gave a brief summary and update on DMC, and stated that the update was on their website. Smith asked if the economic background of the youth had any impact because their parents didn't have the transportation to take the youth to diversion. Hobbs replied that was one area that there was very little data to draw on. Houston stated that people in lower socioeconomic status typically had jobs that if they weren't there they didn't get paid or could lose their jobs, so parents couldn't afford to take off work to transport kids to diversion locations.

Batton asked if agencies had been receptive to the results and willing to work with DMC. Hobbs said that they have. Ruiz asked if there was a difference between youths and adults, and incarcerated or not.

P. Award of 2011 Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant Funds - #2011-WF-AX-0035 in the amount of \$1,192,744

Wills reviewed the funds available for award, the procedure used to review the grant applications and the funding recommendations of the Grant Review Committee.

Smith stated that it shows a huge cut for the Nebraska State Patrol and how will that affect their program. Sankey answered that they are eliminating an Assistant Statewide Coordinator position because of the cut in funding. Wills stated that it was because of the loss of ARRA dollars, so they are funded at last year's status.

Q. Appeal of lesser amount awarded from Grant #11-VW-0712 Sandhills Crisis Intervention Program SCIP

Wills stated the procedure used for the award of a lesser amount than requested of Grant #11-VW-0712 Sandhills Crisis Intervention Program SCIP and for sending the notification letter. Wills further outlined the appeal letter from Sandhills Crisis Intervention Program which is on file in the Crime Commission office.

White asked if the board went through a similar process last year. Wills answered yes, but that was a denial of funds and this is just a reduction in funding. Freudenberg stated that the reason for the appeal is because the commission reached its decision in a biased or prejudiced manner and asked if there was any documentation to support that allegation. Wills stated they did not.

Motion

A motion was made by Vaughn and seconded by White to deny the appeal of Grant #11-VW-0712 SCIP and accept the funding recommendations and contingency stipulations of award as outlined by the Grant Review Committee and the Violence Against Women Act Advisory Committee for the Award of 2011 Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant Funds - #2011-WF-AX-0035 in the amount of \$1,192,744. Voting in favor of the motion: Batton, Davis, Houston, Lausten, Overman, Ruiz, Sanders, Sankey, Smith, Swain, Vaughn (Abstain on 11-VW-707) and White. Motion carried.

R. OJJDP State Plan Update

Gans gave a brief update on the OJJDP State Plan. There were no questions or discussion from the board.

Freudenberg asked if anyone in the public sector had any comments or questions. Hearing none, the public hearing portion of the meeting was declared closed.

Smith asked if a person was convicted of a felony and wants to appeal. Stolz stated that the certification remained in place until all appeals have been exhausted.

A motion was made by White and seconded by Sankey to approve the amendments of Title 79, Revocation of Law Enforcement Officer Certification, Chapter 9. Voting in favor of the motion: Batton, Davis, Houston, Lausten, Overman, Ruiz, Sanders, Sankey, Smith, Swain, Vaughn and White. Motion carried unanimously.

There was no other business.
