Subject: David Derickson-Revocation Case # LR-081-11- Recommendation

Time line:

March 3, 2011, revocation complaint filed by James Reiman, Chairman Boyd County Board of Supervisors, against Boyd County Sheriff David Derickson.

March 9 2001, Letter sent to Complainant (James Reiman) acknowledging receipt of original complaint against Derickson.

March 9, 2011, Informal complaint letter sent to Respondent (Derickson) via certified mail.

March 14, 2011, Response received at Crime Commission from Derickson.

April 4, 2011, Letter received containing medical records of Derickson from his attorney, Ms. Kathleen Koenig Rockey, of Copple, Rockey, McKeever & Schlecht law offices in Norfolk, NE.

Background:

At the time of this complaint (March 2011), David Derickson was the elected Sheriff of Boyd County. *As of August 31, 2011, Mr. Derickson is no longer the Sheriff and his current status is 'in-active.'*

Revocation Complaint:

On March 3, 2011, the complainant Reiman, cited § 81-1403(6) Neb. Rev. Statute and believed the conduct of their sheriff (Derickson) over the past year falls within this definition. Neb. Rev. §81-1403 (6) and Title 79, Chap. 9, Nebraska Administrative Code (NAC), cite reasons to revoke or suspend a law enforcement officer certificates, contained in section (6) (c) as "Physical, mental, or emotional incapacity."

References: Incapacity has been defined as an "Inability to work, attend school or perform other daily activities..." as it relates to the Family Medical Leave Act. Frazier v. Iowa Beef Processors, Inc., 200F.3d 1190 (8th Cir. 2000); 29 C.F.R. §825.114(a) (2)(i).

Complaint allegations:

The revocation complaint contained several issues: **First**, Sheriff Derickson had complained of a multitude of physical problems, from neck and back ailments to sinus issues and internal organ problems. Mr. Reiman wrote how Derickson assured the County Board he would pursue surgery immediately and return to work as soon as possible. Reiman also believed Derickson had not undergone any remedial measures for the issues and had been virtually unseen within the Boyd County. And, the only treatment being used was pain medication.

Second: Reiman wrote how deputies have tried to contact the Sheriff with a question, only to find him 'under the influence of medications.'

Third: Reiman wrote how Derickson himself acknowledged he would be physically unable to fulfill his duties as sheriff however, several citizens have 'commented' on seeing the Sheriff in his auto-body shop in Spencer, NE.

Fourth: In citing negligence, Reiman recalled an investigation in 2010, of an alleged sexual assault where the Sheriff's son was a possible witness. There were questions raised about how much the Sheriff knew and how much he revealed to other law enforcement officers. In addition, another incident involved the Sheriff's son being a possible suspect in a burglary at a local used car lot in early 2011. In summary, Mr. Reiman states, "It has become impossible to justify continuing to pay his salary while getting little or nothing in return."

Response from Derickson:

A typed response was received from former Sheriff Derickson addressing each allegation. Additional information was received from his attorney, including sworn affidavits from current and former Boyd County Deputies, disputing the allegations. In addition, letters were submitted from medical personnel out-lining Derickson's medical history.

First: Derickson has had a series of back and neck injuries associated with his work which were the subject of a pending workers compensation claim. Derickson has (*degenerative disc diseases) diagnosed after an MRI in April 15, 2010. *Letter dated November 7, 2010 and signed by Dr. Alan Sossan in Yankton, SD. He has undergone a series of epidural injections. His back surgery was delayed because of an infection in his colon and a sinus infection. Derickson did have a surgical procedure performed on December 26, 2010, for chronic nasal airway obstruction.

Second, he was prescribed medications for pain which made him extremely sleepy. On one occasion, after taking medication and going to sleep, he received a phone call from one of his deputies about a case. Derickson admitted he was groggy after being awakened from a deep sleep. Derickson stated, "Quite simply I've attempted to perform all my functions, however it has been difficult to make it to the office and I've done work from my home,"

Third: Derickson and his son own an auto body shop in Spencer, he states he doesn't work there because of his injuries, but provides verbal advice to his son.

Fourth: He became aware of an alleged sexual assault because of his position as sheriff. His son Jordan and another male were with the woman the evening where the woman later reported an alleged sexual assault. Derickson was not aware his son was a witness to the alleged sexual assault. *His attorney obtained a statement from the lead investigator Soukup (former deputy) in an affidavit, where the former deputy states, "Jordan Derickson; son of David Derickson was never considered a suspect in the investigation."

In addition, Derickson wrote how he involved himself in the investigation of a burglary of a building, where tools were taken. Derickson stated knew his son Jordan possessed a key to a building which was burglarized, which could have termed him a 'person of interest,' but Jordan was never identified as a possible suspect which would have removed the Sheriff from the investigation. He further wrote, "I have never been contacted by the county attorney or other law enforcement agencies suggesting that I should not have been involvement in the burglary investigation."

Finally, copies of photos were provided from an event in Boyd County where 'Larry the Cable Guy' was featured. The sheriff and his deputies assisted in crowd control and were photographed alongside 'The Cable Guy.' The date imprint on the photos is 2012/09/09, which is contrary to the statement how the sheriff was never seen in the county.

Recommendation:

It appears rumors, misinformation and assumptions from undocumented sources resulted in this revocation complaint. Therefore, I am requesting no further action be brought against Mr. Derickson and this matter be considered closed.

The Nebraska Crime Commission and UNO's Consortium for Crime and Justice Research hosted a JAG stakeholder meeting on July 11, 2013, to identify and update priorities for the 2012-2015 JAG Strategic Plan. The goals of the meeting were threefold. First, we wanted to ensure that all interested stakeholders had a voice in identifying funding priorities for the strategic plan. Second, we wanted to ensure that all identified priorities were mutually exclusive. Our third goal was to develop funding priorities that were roughly comparable in scope. In the course of the meeting, it also became clear that all seven federal purpose areas for JAG funding should be equally represented by funding priorities. To this end, fourteen funding priorities were identified across the seven federal purpose areas.

The meeting ended with a discussion of the distribution of stakeholder votes across the seven federal purpose areas. The stakeholder group discussed two options for ranking the funding priorities: 1) a simple ranking by the responses of survey respondents, 2) a weighted ranking in which votes from each federal purpose area had an overall weight that was equal. For example, if the federal purpose area with the most stakeholder respondents had six voters and another federal purpose area had only three stakeholder respondents, the latter votes would be given a weight of "2" so that each purpose area had an equal weight of 6 votes. The final decision of the group was that the results would be presented both ways, weighted and un-weighted.

Subsequent to the July 11 meeting, these fourteen funding priorities were included in an online survey that was distributed to the 24 JAG stakeholders. In all, 22 stakeholders responded to the survey. The question asked for each funding priority was the following: "Please provide your level of agreement that the following activities should be a TOP PRIORITY for the future use of Nebraska's JAG funds." Respondents were asked to rate all fourteen funding priorities, two for each of the seven federal purpose areas. The coding of the responses was as follows: Strongly Disagree = 0, Disagree = 1, Neither Agree/Disagree = 2, Agree = 3, Strongly Agree = 4. The mean ranking is presented in Table 1 for the un-weighted results and Table 2 for the weighted results. Table 1 includes the results from 22 respondents. Table 2 includes the results from 42 theoretical responses calculated from the 22 actual responses. The federal purpose area with the most stakeholders had 6 stakeholders, so responses from each purpose area were weighted to equal six, resulting in 42 responses (7 federal purpose areas X 6 respondents).

Un-weighted results. Table 1 includes the un-weighted ranking of all fourteen funding priorities. The highest ranked funding priority is from the Planning, Evaluation and Technology federal purpose area: "Enhancement of statewide data collection and sharing (e.g. NCJIS)". The rank score is 3.182, which represents a high level of agreement, as a score of "3" represents that the mean level of support was "agree". This is the only funding priority receiving a score higher than three.

Three other funding priorities received comparatively high scores. "Efforts to enhance information sharing across law enforcement and service provision agencies (e.g. findings from EBPs)", also from the Planning, Evaluation and Technology federal purpose area, received a mean score of 2.955. The next two funding priorities have a tied ranking score of 2.909. The first was "Reduction of criminal activities in communities through prevention and education


programs (e.g. coordinated afterschool programs, mentoring programs, gang prevention initiatives, employability programs)”, which fell under the Prevention and Education federal purpose area. The second, from the Corrections/Community Corrections federal purpose area, is “Initiatives that reduce recidivism throughout the correctional process (e.g. re-entry initiatives, pre-trial release initiatives)”. These findings are presented graphically in Figure 1.

Weighted results. The weighted results are statistically adjusted so that respondents representing the federal purpose areas are given equal consideration *as a purpose area*. In other words, if there were six respondents from purpose area "A" and three respondents from purpose area "B", results from the latter respondents would, in essence, be counted twice or given double the weight of respondents from purpose area "A".


Table 2 indicates that the weighted results do not differ substantially from the un-weighted results. In fact, three of the top four funding priorities from Table 1 are also top funding priorities in Table 2. One exception is "Corrections/Community Corrections: Initiatives that reduce recidivism throughout the correctional process (e.g. re-entry initiatives, pre-trial release initiatives)". Whereas in the un-weighted results this funding priority is tied for third in the rankings, in the weighted results, this funding priority is ranked sixth. In the weighted results, both of the Planning, Evaluation & Technology funding priorities are highly ranked, with scores higher than three. These results are presented graphically in Figure 2.
