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# Nebraska Uniform Crime Reporting Program

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## INTRODUCTION

This annual report presents data on crime and arrests reported by law enforcement agencies through the Nebraska Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program. During 2001, 160 law enforcement agencies submitted monthly UCR's to the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, hereafter referred to as the Commission, which administers the Nebraska UCR Program. The Nebraska UCR Program submits the data to the National UCR Program which is administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

### **The National UCR Program - Historical Background\***

Recognizing a need for national crime statistics, the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) formed the Committee on Uniform Crime Records in the 1920's to develop a system of uniform police statistics. Establishing offenses known to law enforcement as the appropriate measure, the Committee evaluated various crimes on the basis of their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, pervasiveness in all geographic areas of the country, and likelihood of being reported to law enforcement. After studying state criminal codes and making an evaluation of the record keeping practices in use, the Committee in 1929 completed a plan for crime reporting which became the foundation of the UCR Program.

Seven offenses were chosen to serve as an index for gauging fluctuations in the overall volume and rate of crime. Known collectively as the Crime Index, these offenses included the violent crimes of murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault and the property crimes of burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft. By congressional mandate, arson was added as the eighth Index offense in 1979.

During the early planning of the program, it was recognized that the differences among criminal codes precluded a mere aggregation of state statistics to arrive at a national total. Further, because of the variances in punishment for the same offenses in different state codes, no distinction between felony and misdemeanor crimes was possible. To avoid these problems and provide nationwide uniformity in crime reporting, standardized offense definitions by which law enforcement agencies were to submit data, without regard for local statutes, were formulated.

### **National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) - Redesigned UCR Program\***

Throughout the years, the UCR Program has remained virtually unchanged in terms of data collected and disseminated. Recognizing the need for improved statistics, law enforcement called for a thorough evaluative study that would modernize the UCR Program. The FBI fully concurred with the need for an updated program and lent its complete support, formulating an examination of the historical evolution of the Program (1982). The second phase involved an examination of potential futures for UCR and concluded with a set of recommended changes set forth in the draft "Blueprint

for the Future of the Uniform Crime Reporting Program” (1985). At the eighth National UCR Conference held in 1985, the phase two recommendations were presented and the overall concept for the revised Program was unanimously approved. One of the first steps taken by the FBI to implement the redesigned UCR was the development of new offense definitions and data elements. A pilot project was conducted during 1987 in South Carolina. In 1988, the FBI presented a draft of reporting guidelines to law enforcement executives at a national conference. At the conference, there was an endorsement that a new, incident-based reporting system be established. The National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) will collect data on each single incident and arrest within 22 crime categories. For each offense known to police within these categories, incident, victim, property, offender, and arrestee information will be gathered when available. The goal of the redesign is to modernize crime information by collecting data presently maintained in law enforcement records; the enhanced UCR Program is, therefore, a byproduct of current records systems. The FBI was able to accept NIBRS data as of January 1989 and twenty-two states, including Nebraska, are now certified for submission of NIBRS data.

### **The Nebraska UCR Program**

During the 1970's, the FBI actively assisted individual states in the development of state UCR Programs which would be compatible with the national program. The Nebraska UCR Program became operational on January 1, 1971. Commencing on that date, law enforcement agencies in Nebraska began submitting UCR's to one central agency in Nebraska, the Commission, and the reports are in turn forwarded to the National Program after review and correction. The State Patrol, all sheriffs' departments, and police departments of municipalities of 1,500 population and over are required to submit UCR's by the seventh day after the end of the month. In 1982, the Nebraska Program became an "incident-based" reporting system. That is, crimes were reported by individual incident. This change in reporting has laid the groundwork for conversion to the new Nebraska Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS), which will be compatible with the National Incident-Based Reporting System. Law enforcement agencies may convert to NIBRS as they acquire the computer resources to submit NIBRS data. The following agencies submitted NIBRS data to the Commission during 2001: Adams Co. ### **Crime Index**

The extent, fluctuation and distribution of crime in the state is measured by the crime index. The crime index is composed of the following offenses: murder, nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Many categories of crime are not of sufficient importance to be included in the index; some serious crimes, such as kidnaping, do not occur with enough regularity to be meaningful in the index. With these considerations in mind, the above offenses were selected as a group to serve as a measure of crime.

### **Clearances**

For UCR purposes, an offense can be cleared by arrest or by exceptional means. An offense can be

cleared by arrest when the offender is identified, there is enough evidence to charge him and he is actually taken into custody. The arrest of one person can clear several offenses and several persons may clear one offense. When some element beyond police control precludes formal charges against the offender, such as the victim's refusal to prosecute or death of the offender, an offense can be cleared by exceptional means.

## **Crime Rate**

Crime rates relate the incidence of crime to population. Estimates of current population are used in computing crime rates. Crime rates are more refined indicators for comparative purposes than are volume figures. To compute a crime rate per 100,000 population, first divide the population of the area by 100,000 and then divide the crime index by the resulting figure. At various times throughout this report a rate per 1,000 population is used to be more meaningful for the state.

## **Crime Factors**

Statistics gathered under the UCR Program are law enforcement statistics. The agencies report the offense and arrest data according to the standard offense classifications and not according to state statutes or local ordinances. Offenses are related to municipality and county in which they occur, rather than to the agency which may investigate, arrest or otherwise dispose of the case. The clearance is attributed to the municipality or county in which the offense occurred, even though the arresting agency may not be the department originally reporting the offense.

The factors which influence crime rates are dependent upon many characteristics of the community, and, therefore, when attempting to interpret the crime statistics presented herein, one should be aware of the social structure and the factors that lead to or cause criminal behavior.

Awareness of the presence of certain crime factors, which may influence the resulting volume and type of statistics presented, is necessary if fair and equitable conclusions are to be drawn. These crime influencing factors are present, to some degree, in every community and their presence affects, in varying degrees, the crime experience of that community. Attempts at comparison of crime figures between communities should not be made without first considering the individual factors present in each community. Below are some of the conditions which will by type and volume affect the crime that occurs from place to place:

- Population density and degree of urbanization.

- Variations in composition of the population, particularly youth concentration.

- Stability of population with respect to residents' mobility, commuting patterns, and transient factors.

- Modes of transportation and highway system.

- Economic conditions, including median income, poverty level, and job availability.

- Cultural factors and educational, recreational, and religious characteristics.

- Family conditions with respect to divorce and family cohesiveness.

- Climate.

- Effective strength of law enforcement agencies.

- Administrative and investigative emphases of law enforcement.

- Policies of other components of the criminal justice system (i.e., prosecutorial, judicial, correctional, and probational).

Citizens' attitudes towards crime.

Crime reporting practices of the citizenry.

Caution should always be used when using the crime statistics presented herein, however, it should also be kept in mind that the data presented is the most accurate currently available. The law enforcement personnel who provide the data are to be commended for their efforts to provide accurate data. Without their sincere cooperation, this publication would not be possible. Crime is a social problem and therefore, should be a concern of the entire community.

## **DEFINITIONS OF OFFENSES**

Uniformity of reporting depends upon the proper classification of offenses by the law enforcement agencies. It must be emphasized that the following definitions are not meant to be legal definitions as they are written in the Nebraska Penal Code. The purpose of these classifications is to establish a uniform national system for classifying similar offenses even though their legal definitions may vary considerably from state to state.

### **Part I Offenses** (Offense and arrest data are collected for Part I Offenses)

**Criminal Homicide** - Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter - the willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another. Death by Negligence - the killing of another person through gross negligence.

**Forcible Rape** - the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included; however, statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are excluded.

**Robbery** - the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

**Aggravated Assault** - an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. Attempts are included since it is not necessary that an injury result when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime were successfully completed.

**Burglary** - the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. The use of force to gain entry is not required to classify an offense as burglary.

**Larceny-Theft** - the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. This category does not include embezzlement, confidence games, forgery, and worthless checks.

**Motor Vehicle Theft** - the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

**Arson** - any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent

to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

**Part II Offenses** (Offense and arrest data are collected for Simple Assault while only arrest data are collected for the remaining Part II Offenses)

**Simple Assault** - any assault which does not involve the use of a firearm, knife, cutting instrument, or other dangerous weapon and in which there was no serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

**Forgery and Counterfeiting** - all offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud anything false in the semblance of that which is true.

**Fraud** - fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretense. Includes bad checks, confidence games, etc.

**Embezzlement** - the misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

**Stolen Property** - all offenses of buying, receiving, possessing, or concealing stolen property as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

**Vandalism / Destruction of Property** - all willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth or any other such means as may be specified by law or ordinance.

**Weapons** - includes violations of weapons laws such as manufacture, sale or possession of deadly weapons; carrying deadly weapons; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; aliens possessing deadly weapons; using or manufacturing silencers; and all attempts to commit any of the above offenses.

**Prostitution and Commercialized Vice** - includes the sex offenses of a commercialized nature such as prostitution; keeping a bawdy house, disorderly house or house of ill repute; pandering, procuring, transporting or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc., and all attempts to commit any of the above.

**Sex Offenses** - includes all sex offenses other than forcible rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. This encompasses offenses against chastity, common decency, morals and the like such as adultery and fornication, buggery, incest, indecent exposure, sodomy, statutory rape (no force) and all attempts to commit any of the above.

**Drug Abuse Violations** - statistics for these arrests are requested on the basis of the narcotics used. This includes all arrests for the violation of state and local laws, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing and making of narcotic drugs. Four divisions of narcotic drugs are recognized. These are:

- (a) Opium and cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine),
- (b) Marijuana,
- (c) Synthetic narcotics which can cause true addiction (demerol, methadones) and
- (d) Other dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, benzedrine).

**Gambling** - includes all charges relating to promoting, permitting or engaging in illegal gambling. This classification is broken into three divisions:

- (a) bookmaking (horse and sport book)
- (b) numbers and lottery and
- (c) all other gambling.

**Offenses Against Family and Children** - includes all charges of nonsupport, neglect or abuse of family and children such as desertion, abandonment or nonsupport, neglect or abuse of child, or nonpayment of alimony.

**Driving Under the Influence** - limited to driving or operating any vehicle while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotic drugs.

**Liquor Laws** - with the exception of drunkenness and driving under the influence, all state or local liquor law violations are placed in this class. Federal violations are not included. Include manufacturing, selling, transporting, furnishing or possessing intoxicating liquor, including minors in possession, maintaining unlawful drinking places, bootlegging, operating a still, furnishing liquor to a minor, using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor, and drinking on a train or public conveyance.

**Disorderly Conduct - Disturbing the Peace** - a breach of the peace (unlawful assembly, disturbing the peace, disturbing meetings, blasphemy, profanity, obscene language, refusing to assist an officer, etc.)

**All Other Offenses** - includes all violations of state and local laws not otherwise classified.

**Curfew and Loitering Law Violations** - (Juveniles) all arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

**Runaways** - (Juveniles) limited to juveniles taken into custody who have run away from the reporting jurisdiction.

# **CRIME INDEX OFFENSES**

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The index offenses include the violent crimes of murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, and the property crimes of burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. During 2001, 160 law enforcement agencies submitted Uniform Crime Reports on a monthly basis. These reports provided information on offenses that were reported or known to law enforcement, as well as information on persons arrested or cited for criminal violations and offenses cleared by arrest or by exceptional means.

## **Volume**

A total of 72,287 index offenses were reported or known to law enforcement agencies in 2001. The violent crimes of murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, and felony assault accounted for 7.0 percent of the total index offenses. The property crimes of burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson accounted for 93.0 percent of the total offenses.

Larceny-theft was the most frequently reported crime, accounting for 70.6 percent of the total crimes reported.

## **Crime Rates**

In 2001, the rate of crimes per 1,000 population was 42.4, based upon an estimated population of 1,713,235. The crime rate for violent crimes was 3.0 crimes per 1,000 population. There were 39.2 property crimes per 1,000 population.

## **Clearances and Arrests**

A total of 13,102 index offenses were reported cleared during 2001, a clearance rate of 18.1 percent. Murder, manslaughter had the highest clearance rate, 95.1 percent. Violent crimes had a clearance rate of 64.0 percent and crimes against property had a clearance rate of 14.7 percent.

During 2001, a total of 12,848 persons were arrested for index offenses. Juvenile arrests accounted for 36 percent of the arrests for index offenses. The age group of 13-14 accounted for the largest percentage of persons arrested for index offenses, eight percent.





# **MURDER, MANSLAUGHTER**

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Murder and nonnegligent manslaughter are defined as the willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another. Not included in this definition are deaths caused by negligence, suicide, or accidental deaths. Attempts to commit murder are classified as aggravated assault.

## **Volume and Rate**

During 2001, a total of 41 murder, manslaughters were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Murder, manslaughter accounted for 0.8 percent of all violent crimes and one-tenth of one percent of all index offenses. In 2001, there were .02 murders per 1,000 population. Forty murder, manslaughters were cleared in 2001, a clearance rate of 66.7 percent.

## **Murder, Manslaughter Analysis**

The age group of 25-29 accounted for the highest percentage of persons arrested for murder, manslaughter, 22 percent. Males accounted for 86 percent and females accounted for 14 percent. Of the persons arrested, 69 percent were White and 31 percent were black.

Law enforcement agencies are requested to provide additional information regarding the victim, the offender, the type of weapon used, and the relationship of the victim to the offender(s). The Omaha Police Department did not provide supplementary reports during 2001.

The victim data revealed that 61 percent of the victims were male while 39 percent were female. Victims in the age group of 30-39 accounted for 39 percent of the total victims. Victims age 17 and under accounted for 6 percent and victims age 60 and above accounted for 17 percent. An analysis by race revealed that 89 percent were White and 11 percent were Black.

Outside of the City of Omaha, most murders, 83 percent, were committed either by a relative or an acquaintance of the victim. A further breakdown indicated that 44 percent were committed by a relative; 39 percent were committed by an acquaintance; and in 17 percent of the incidents the offender was either a stranger or was unknown.





# **FORCIBLE RAPE**

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Forcible rape is defined as the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. All rapes and attempts to rape are counted. Carnal abuse, without force (statutory rape) and other sex offenses are not included.

## **Volume and Rate**

During 2001, law enforcement agencies in Nebraska reported a total of 405 forcible rapes. Forcible rape accounted for 8.0 percent of all violent crimes and 0.6 percent of all index crimes. In 2001, there were 0.3 rapes per 1,000 population. A total of 256 forcible rapes, 63.2 percent, were cleared during 2001.

## **Analysis of Rape**

Rape by force accounted for 89.4 percent of all forcible rapes and 10.6 percent were attempts to rape.

The age group of 35-39 accounted for the highest percentage of persons arrested for forcible rape, 15 percent. Juvenile arrests accounted for 9 percent of all persons arrested for forcible rape.

## **Rape Circumstances**

Law enforcement agencies are asked to submit a supplementary report on the circumstances surrounding any rape by force and attempt to rape. Supplementary reports were received on 214 cases. The Omaha Police Department did not provide supplementary reports in 2001. Victims under the age of 25 accounted for 77 percent of the total victims. Of those victims under age 25, 41 percent were in the age group of 18 thru 24 and 35 percent were in the age group of 11 thru 15.



# ROBBERY

---

Robbery is the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear. Robbery takes place in the presence of the victim. The victim, who usually is the owner or person having custody of the property is directly confronted by the perpetrator and is threatened with force or fear that force will be used.

## **Volume and Rate**

During 2001, a total of 1,128 robberies were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Robbery accounted for 22.2 percent of all violent crimes and 1.6 percent of all index crimes. In 2001, there were 0.7 robberies per 1,000 population. A total of 436 robberies, 38.7 percent, were cleared in 2001.

## **Analysis of Robbery**

A firearm was used in 41 percent of all robberies, a knife or cutting instrument was used in 10 percent, other dangerous weapons were used in 7 percent and strong-arm tactics were used in 41 percent of all robberies.

Robberies occurring on highways, streets, alleys, etc., accounted for 43 percent of all robberies. Robberies occurring at residences accounted for 17 percent. Bank robberies increased 43%, from 47 in 2000 to 67 in 2001.

18 year olds accounted for the greatest percentage of persons arrested for robbery, 13 percent. Juveniles accounted for 26 percent of all arrests for robbery.

Of persons arrested for robbery, 45 percent were White, 51 percent were Black, 3 percent were American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 1 percent were Asian/Pacific Islander.

Law enforcement agencies reported a total value of \$908,845 stolen in robbery offenses.





# **AGGRAVATED ASSAULT**

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Aggravated assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. Aggravated assault usually involves the use of a weapon or other means likely to produce death or great bodily injury. Attempts are included since it is not necessary that an injury result when a firearm, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious injury if the crime were successfully completed.

## **Volume and Rate**

During 2001, there were 3,507 aggravated assaults reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Aggravated assaults accounted for 69.0 percent of all violent crimes and 4.9 percent of all index crimes. In 2001, there were 2.0 aggravated assaults per 1,000 population. A total of 2,521 aggravated assaults, 71.9 percent, were cleared in 2001.


## **Analysis of Aggravated Assault**

The use of other dangerous weapon was involved in 47 percent of all aggravated assaults. A firearm was used in 16 percent, a knife was used in 19 percent, and hands/fists/feet were used in 18 percent.


The age group of 25-29 accounted for the highest percentage of persons arrested for aggravated assault, 15 percent. Juveniles accounted for 14 percent of all arrests for aggravated assault.

An analysis of aggravated assault arrests revealed that 68 percent were White, 27 percent were Black, 5 percent were American Indian/Alaskan Native, and less than one percent were Asian/Pacific Islander.

# **BURGLARY**

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Burglary is defined as any unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any structure to commit a felony or theft. The use of force to gain entry is not required to classify an offense as burglary. Burglary is divided into three categories: forcible entry, unlawful entry - no force, and attempted forcible entry.

## **Volume and Rate**

During 2001, a total of 9,364 burglaries were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Burglary accounted for 13.9 percent of all property crimes and 14.1 percent of all index crimes. In 2001, there were 5.5 burglaries per 1,000 population. A total of 1,429 burglaries, 15.3 percent, were cleared in 2001.

## **Analysis of Burglary**

Of all burglaries reported, 62 percent involved residences and 38 percent involved non-residences. Forced entries accounted for 64.6 percent of the total burglaries, no force entries accounted for 27.8 percent, and attempted forced entries accounted for 7.6 percent.

The age groups of 25-29 and 35-39 accounted for the highest percentage of persons arrested for burglary, each accounting for 8 percent of the total arrests. Juveniles accounted for 32 percent of all persons arrested for burglary.

Of persons arrested for burglary, 82 percent were White, 14 percent were Black, 4 percent were American Indian/Alaskan Native and less than one percent were Asian/Pacific Islander.

Law enforcement agencies reported property worth \$6,395,218 stolen in burglary offenses.



# LARCENY - THEFT

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Larceny-theft is the unlawful taking of the property of another with the intent of depriving that person of ownership. This category does not include embezzlement, confidence games, forgery, or worthless checks.

## Volume and Rate

During 2001, a total of 51,045 larceny-thefts were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Larceny-theft accounted for 76.0 percent of the crimes against property and 70.6 percent of all index crimes. In 2001, there were 29.8 larceny-thefts per 1,000 population. A total of 6,779 larceny-thefts, 13.3 percent, were cleared.

## Analysis of Larceny-Theft


Of the total larceny-thefts reported, thefts from motor vehicles accounted for 26.0 percent, shoplifting accounted for 17.6 percent, and thefts from buildings accounted for 16.0 percent.

The age group of 13-14 accounted for 11 percent of the total number of persons arrested for larceny-theft. Juveniles accounted for 38 percent of the total number arrested.

Of the persons arrested for larceny-theft, 72 percent were White, 25 percent were Black, 3 percent were American Indian/Alaskan Native, and less than one percent were Asian/Pacific Islander.

Law enforcement agencies reported a total value of \$12,841,250 stolen in larceny-theft offenses.

# **MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT**

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Motor vehicle theft is defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle, including joyriding. A motor vehicle is defined as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on land surface and not on rails. Examples of motor vehicles are automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, motor scooters, snowmobiles, etc. Thefts of farm equipment, bulldozers, airplanes, and construction equipment are not included in the definition of a motor vehicle.

## **Volume and Rate**

During 2001, there were 6,336 motor vehicle thefts reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. Motor vehicle thefts accounted for 9.4 percent of all property crimes and 8.8 percent of all index offenses. In 2001, there were 3.7 motor vehicle thefts per 1,000 population. There were 1,605 motor vehicle thefts cleared in 2001, a clearance rate of 25.3 percent.

## **Analysis of Motor Vehicle Theft**

During 2001, law enforcement agencies provided additional information regarding types of vehicles stolen. The agencies reported 4,510 autos, 1,434 trucks and buses, and 392 other vehicles stolen.

The age group of 15 accounted for the highest percentage of persons arrested for motor vehicle theft, accounting for 12 percent of the total. Juveniles accounted for 42 percent of all arrests for motor vehicle theft.

Of the persons arrested for motor vehicle theft, 73 percent were White, 21 percent were Black, 4 percent were American Indian/Alaskan Native, and less than one percent were Asian/Pacific Islander.


Law enforcement agencies reported property worth \$8,113,747 stolen in motor vehicle thefts.

# ARSON

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Arson is any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc. The State Fire Marshal's office is the primary source of arson data.

## Volume and Rate

During 2001, there were 461 offenses of arson reported. Arson accounted for 0.7 percent of the property crimes and 0.6 percent of all index offenses. In 2001, there were 0.3 arsons per 1,000 population. There were 37 arsons cleared in 2001, an 8.0 percent clearance rate.


## Analysis of Arson

The total estimated value of property damage due to arson amounted to \$4,305,719 in 2001. Property damage to 178 structures was \$2,967,375. The 193 mobile arsons (motor vehicles and mobile property - trailers, recreational vehicles, airplanes) resulted in \$1,001,510 worth of property damage. In 90 other types of arson, the property damage was \$336,834. The average value of property damage per arson incident was \$9,339.95.

The age group of 10-12 accounted for the greatest percentage of persons arrested for arson, accounting for 24 percent of the total arrested. Juveniles accounted for 70 percent of all arrests for arson.

Of the persons arrested for arson, 82 percent were White, 16 percent were Black, and two percent were American Indian/Alaskan Native.

## **SIMPLE ASSAULT**

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Simple assault is defined as any assault which does not involve the use of a firearm, knife, cutting instrument, or other dangerous weapon and in which there is no serious or aggravated injury to the victim. Simple assault includes intimidation, assault and battery, coercion, resisting or obstructing an officer, hazing, and attempts to commit all of these acts.

### **Volume and Rate**

During 2001, a total of 16,503 simple assaults were reported by law enforcement agencies in Nebraska. A total of 12,837 simple assaults, 77.8 percent, were cleared in 2001. There were 9.6 simple assaults per 1,000 population.

### **Analysis of Simple Assault**

The age group of 25-29 accounted for the greatest percentage of persons arrested for simple assault, 13.6 percent. Juveniles accounted for 19.7 percent of all arrests for simple assault.

Of persons arrested for simple assault, 76 percent were White, 20 percent were Black, 4 percent were American Indian/Alaskan Native, and less than one percent were Asian/Pacific Islander.

# DOMESTIC ASSAULT

As a result of the passage of Legislative Bill 889 in 1997, law enforcement agencies began indicating if an aggravated or simple assault was domestic related. This indication was also made on any corresponding arrest. The Omaha Police Department did not provide data on domestic assaults during 2001.


Domestic is defined by state statute as relating to family or household members and includes spouses, ex-spouses, children, persons who are residing together, persons who have resided together in the past, persons who have a child in common, or persons related by consanguinity or affinity.

During 2001, there were a total of 3,928 domestic assaults reported outside of the City of Omaha. There were 379 aggravated domestic assaults which represents 9.6 percent of the total and 3,549 simple domestic assaults accounting for 90.4 percent of the total domestic assaults. A total of 2,893 arrests were reported for domestic assaults, with 117 arrested for aggravated domestic assault and 2,776 arrested for simple domestic assault.

**Domestic and Non-Domestic Assaults - 2001**



# HATE CRIMES

Legislative Bill 90, commonly referred to as the hate crime bill, was passed and signed by the Governor in 1997. LB 90 directed the Commission to establish a repository for the collection and analysis of information regarding criminal offenses committed against individuals or groups or their property because of their race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, age, or disability. The criminal offenses are to include: manslaughter; assault in the first, second, or third degree; terroristic threats; stalking; kidnaping; false imprisonment in the first or second degree; sexual assault in the first, second, or third degree; arson in the first, second, or third degree; criminal mischief; and criminal trespass in the first or second degree.

The federal Hate Crime Statistics Act of 1990 required the United States Attorney General to collect data about crimes that manifest evidence of prejudice based on race, religion, sexual-orientation, or ethnicity. Physical and mental disabilities were added in 1994. The crimes included: murder, non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, aggravated assault, simple assault, intimidation, arson, destruction, damage or vandalism of property. The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) collects hate crime data through the UCR Program.

The Commission developed a system of collecting data which would meet the requirements of both LB 90 and the federal system of hate crime reporting. Law enforcement agencies are to submit quarterly reports on hate crimes identifying the type of crime committed, a general description of the location, and the type of bias motivation. During 2001, 105 agencies submitted at least one quarterly report and 49 of those reported all four quarters.

# **ARREST DATA**

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Under the Uniform Crime Reporting Program, an arrest is counted each time a person is taken into custody, summoned, notified, or cited. When a person under the age of 18 commits an offense and the circumstances are such that if the offender were an adult an arrest would be made, the juvenile is counted as an arrest by the reporting agency.

For reporting purposes, one arrest is counted each time a person is taken into custody, regardless of the number of charges placed against him. If an individual is arrested more than once during the year, an arrest is counted each time. When several persons are arrested in connection with the same offense, each is counted as an arrest.

## **Volume and Rate**

Law enforcement agencies in Nebraska reported 95,575 arrests in 2001. There were 56.8 arrests per 1,000 population in 2001 as compared to 57.5 arrests per 1,000 population in 2000.

Arrests for Part I Offenses accounted for 13 percent of the total arrests. Of the arrests for Part I Offenses, larceny-theft accounted for the greatest portion, 76 percent. The greatest percentage of arrests for Part II Offenses (excluding All Other Offenses) was Driving Under the Influence, 15 percent.

During 2001, there were 1,378 arrests for crimes of violence (murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) which accounted for 11 percent of all arrests for Part I Offenses and one percent of the total arrests. There were 11,470 arrests for crimes against property (burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson) which accounted for 89 percent of all arrests for Part I Offenses and 12 percent of the total arrests.

Arrests for Part I Offenses decreased 2 percent from 2000. Arrests for Part II Offenses experienced a decrease of one percent from 2000.

## **Arrests by Age**

The number of persons under the age of 18 (juveniles) arrested during 2001 decreased 9 percent from 2000. The arrests of persons age 18 and over (adults) increased less than one percent.

The arrest of persons under the age of 25 accounted for the following percentages of the total arrests for each index offense: murder, manslaughter - 37 percent; forcible rape - 45 percent; robbery - 69 percent; aggravated assault - 46 percent; burglary - 66 percent; larceny-theft - 65 percent; motor vehicle theft - 74 percent; and arson - 81 percent. Of those persons under the age of 25 arrested for index offenses, persons under the age of 18 accounted for 56 percent.

Persons under the age of 18 were most often arrested for Larceny-Theft, while adults were most often arrested for Driving Under the Influence and All Other Offenses.

## **Arrests by Sex**

In 2001, males accounted for 75 percent of all arrests. Males accounted for 68 percent of arrests for Part I Offenses and 76 percent of arrests for Part II Offenses. Total male arrests decreased 4 percent from 2000 and female arrests decreased less than one percent.

A Liquor Law Violation was the crime for which females were most often arrested. Males were most often arrested for Driving Under the Influence.

## **Arrests by Race**

An analysis of total arrests by race for 2001 indicated 79 percent were White, 18 percent were Black, 3 percent were American Indian/Alaskan Native, and less than one percent were Asian/Pacific Islander.

Race distribution figures for the Part I Offenses revealed that 72 percent were White, 24 percent were Black, 3 percent were Indian/Alaskan Native and less than one percent were Asian/Pacific Islander. Race figures for Part II Offenses revealed that 80 percent were White, 17 percent were Black, 3 percent were Indian/Alaskan Native and less than one percent were Asian/Pacific Islander.

An analysis of arrests by race for crimes of violence (murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and felony assault) revealed that 65 percent were White, 31 percent were Black, 4 percent were American Indian/Alaskan Native, and less than one percent were Asian/Pacific Islander.

Race figures for crimes against property (burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft and arson) revealed that 73 percent were White, 23 percent were Black, 3 percent were Indian/Alaskan Native and less than one percent were Asian/Pacific Islander.



# OFFICERS ASSAULTED

The killing or assaulting of a law enforcement officer is a serious problem faced by the law enforcement administrator and should be of the gravest concern to the public at large. Such acts directly affect the functioning of proper law enforcement operations and thus reduce the ability of our law enforcement agencies to combat crime and maintain law and order. The ambitious young person who today considers a career in law enforcement must also consider the risk of being killed or assaulted by a member of the society he is sworn to protect. There were no law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty in 2001.

During 2001, there were 174 assaults on law enforcement officers. While every assault does not result in personal injury to the officer involved, many of them do result in physical harm to the officer and loss of duty time. During 2001, personal injury was involved in 39 percent of the assaults. 36 percent of the assaults occurred while responding to disturbance calls and 84 percent of those were inflicted with hands, fists, or feet.
